Fire Blasts Grain Storage

IONE, Ore., Feb. 14 (AP)—Wheat growers of this area today estimated at \$200,000 their losses in a fire that destroyed a grain elevator in Morrow county's Jordan district three miles east of here.

The 105-foot concrete elevator burst into flames shortly after loading operations began yesterday. Without fire-fighting equipment in the area, workmen stood helplessly as flames ate into the 150,000 bushels of wheat stored there.

Late in the day a pump was rigged at an irrigation canal, but the fire was beyond control. A spark of static electricity was blamed tentatively.

Krug Says Raver To Stay In Office

POCATELLO, Ida., Feb. 14 (AP)—Secretary of the Interior J. A. Krug said here today he does not plan to discharge Dr. Paul Raver, administrator of the Bonneville power administration, despite his "differences" with Rep. Lowell Stockman (R-Ore.).

The secretary said Raver "did an outstanding job in providing power early in the war and I'm confident that any differences which may have developed with Rep. Stockman can be worked out."

The Oregon representative had asked Raver's discharge on grounds he had failed to furnish full information and give complete cooperation to a house committee handling interior department appropriations.

101 Ranch Founder's Sister Passes

LANCASTER, Pa., Feb. 14 (AP)—Mrs. Alma Miller England, 71, daughter of the late George W. Miller, founder of the well-known "101 ranch" here, died yesterday after suffering a cerebral hemorrhage.

A brother, Zack T. Miller of Ponca City, Okla., is the last

survivor of the "three Miller brothers," sons of the ranch founder.

Mrs. England, a graduate of Vassar college in 1899, was born in Newtonia, Mont.

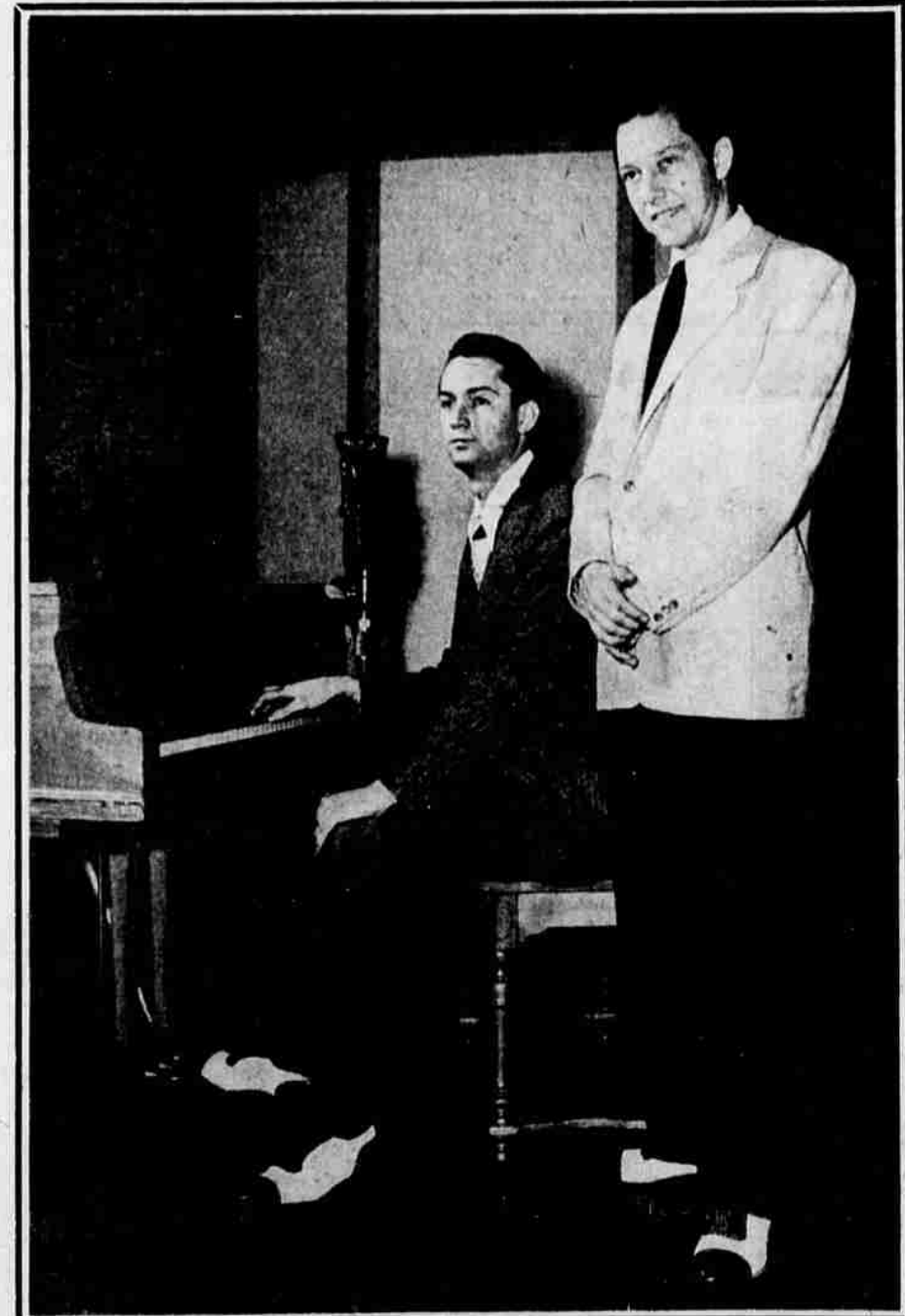
