

King Gets Big Ovation In Africa

CAPETOWN, South Africa, Feb. 17 (AP)—A joyous multitude of 200,000 packed Capetown streets today and roared a friendly welcome to King George VI, Queen Elizabeth and their daughters. It was the youngest dominion's first sight of a British royal family.

The royal party stepped ashore into the sweltering South African heat from the battleship Vanguard after a 6000-mile cruise from frigid, coal-shy England. Blacks and whites stood side by side, yelling and waving South African and British flags. Nowhere was there a sign of disdain.

The family rode in motor cars from the docks to government house, evincing interest in all along the three-mile route.

The queen was the most animated. She was dressed in her favored blue, with fluttering ostrich feathers in her hat and a small umbrella protecting her from the sultry sun.

King George wore a white naval uniform. He was responsive to every show of good will and seemed touched as his limousine passed slowly by long lines of former service men, some of them greybeards, standing at attention.

Princesses Elizabeth and Margaret Rose were on their first trip abroad and appeared to find novelty and stimulation in all they saw. The pageant was unrivaled in South African history.

Throughout the nation, the VA's load of veteran-patients has been increasing steadily. In this state six months ago, 977 veterans were hospitalized by the agency.

Legislature To Get New Labor Bills

SALEM, Feb. 17 (AP)—The Oregon legislature's dispute over legislation to restrict labor unions was intensified today when Sen. Eugene E. Marsh, McMinnville, announced he is sponsoring three bills to outlaw secondary boycotts, to permit courts to issue injunctions in labor disputes, and to permit the state labor commissioner to sponsor secret elections among employees to determine whether a labor dispute exists.

Marsh, who was speaker of the house in 1945, said he expects to draft the bills today.

The bill to permit court injunctions would repeal Oregon's law which prevents the court injunctions. The secondary boycott measure would declare illegal any action by labor unions against "hot cargo."

The house already has proposed constitutional amendments to ban the closed shop and to require incorporation of labor unions.

As the legislature started its sixth week today, the harmony that prevailed in the first five weeks disappeared and tempers began to flare up.

Rosenwald Head Hits At Poverty

PORTLAND, Feb. 17 (AP)—America has failed to spread opportunity and plenty to all of its peoples, Dr. Edwin R. Emory, Chicago, president of the Julius Rosenwald fund, told an Urban League of Portland audience here last night.

He told the organization which works for the improvement of the status of Portland's 12,000 negroes that while the nation's achievements have been magnificent some of our population live under conditions of squalor and poverty "equal to the worst in the world."

Herald And News, KFLW Staffs Have Busy Day

The news staff of The Herald and News and radio station KFLW spent a busy Sunday maintaining prompt coverage of the disastrous Evans apartment fire.

Chuck Cecil, KFLW announcer, heard the fire sirens about 6 a. m., and started the news coverage machinery. His call to Malcolm Epley, managing editor, put the news

paper staff on the job. Lois Stewart, city editor, and Hale Scarbrough, sports and general assignment man, went to work on the story, one of the biggest in Klamath Falls history. Wes Guderian, photographer, was at the scene by 6:30 a. m.

Bulletin service and special features kept KFLW radio listeners informed throughout the day. At 8:30 p. m., Cecil was able to present an eye-witness story from three survivors, Mr. and Mrs. Lionel Hankins and Reginald Ashworth, with fill-ins by Epley and Mrs. Stewart.

Bulletins followed through the day. At noon, Epley and Mrs. Stewart gave a roundtable account of their observations at the scene of the fire, and another at mid-afternoon. At 6:30 p. m., on the Home Town news, Kelly Roberts' round-up story of the fire gave a complete account, and more news bulletins followed through to 11 p. m., the nightcap edition of the news.

Teen-Age Boys Kill Teacher

NEWCASTLE-UNDER-LYME, England, Feb. 17 (AP)—Ten boys, all 15 or 16 years old, were held without bail today on charges of murdering a 21-year-old teacher at the reform school where they are inmates.

Magistrate Elsie Coghill remanded the boys for further hearing February 25 after a detective sergeant testified that he had explained the seriousness of the charge to them.

"When I was satisfied that they fully appreciate it, I formally charged them with murder. Each then made a statement. The effect of the statement is that all were concerned in the affair," the sergeant said.

Police struggled through deep snow along a railroad track seven miles from the school to arrest the boys, who fled before William Peter Fieldhouse, assistant gardening master, was found dying of gunshot wounds at the school on Saturday.

Vets Education Figure Drops

Disabled Oregon veterans in school or job training under public law 16 increased by 320 from December to January, while ex-servicemen studying under the GI bill declined by 883, Zeno Dent, veterans administration training officer for this area, reported today.

Despite an overall drop of 563, there were still 25,453 veterans in school or job training with federal assistance at the end of January, Dent stated. Those in colleges and schools numbered 18,354, only 19 fewer than in December, although many colleges changed terms.

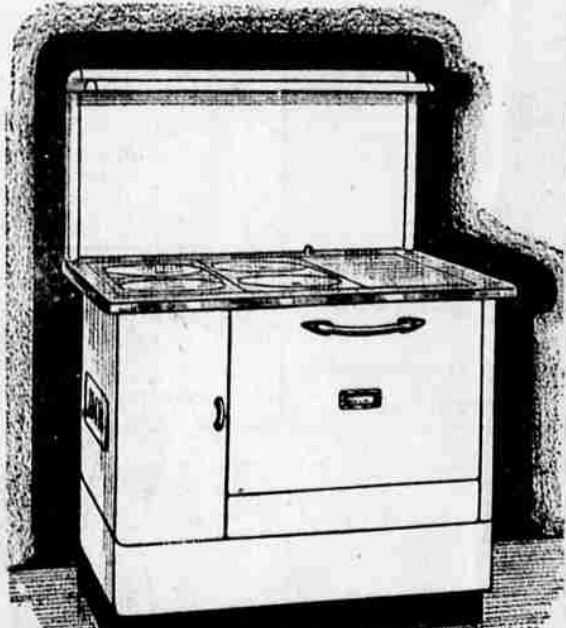

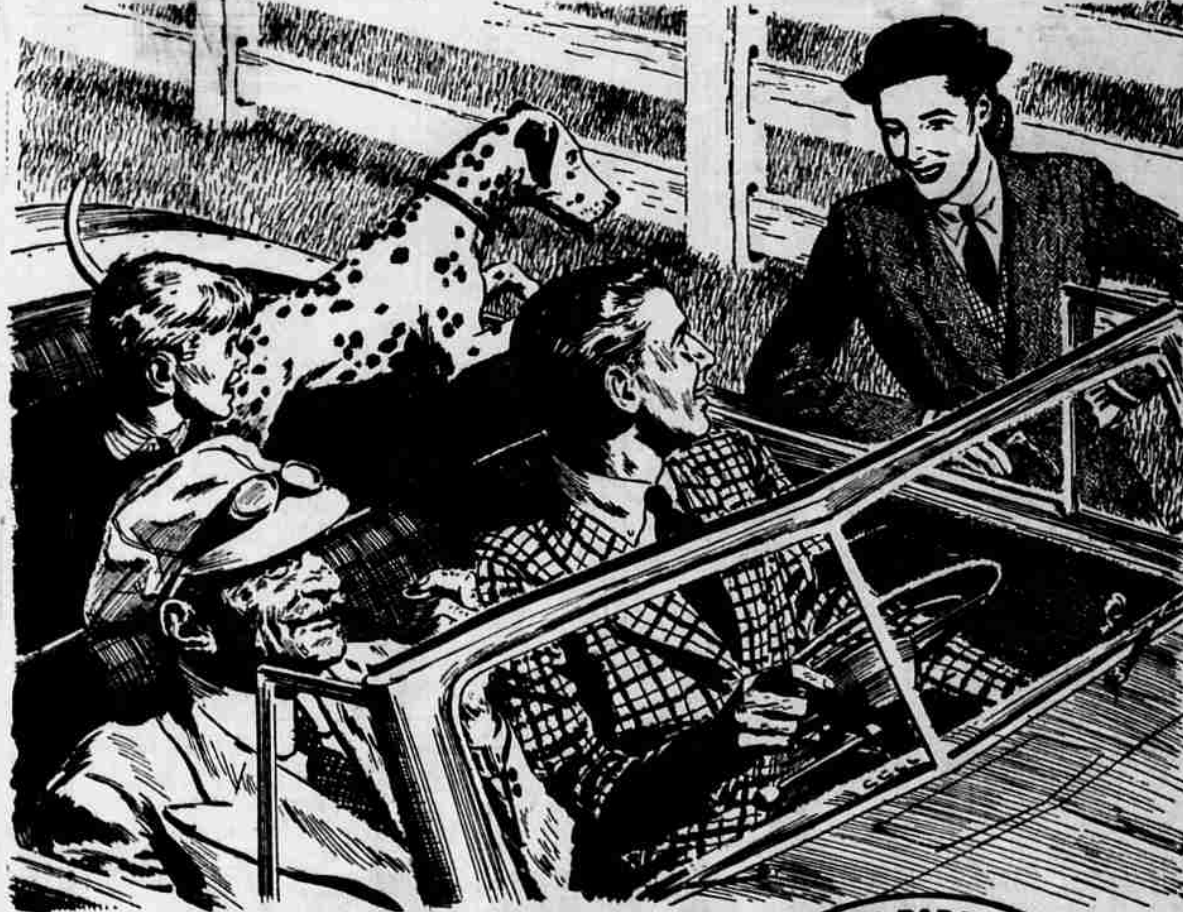
