

All Set For WAA Sale To Open Tues.

Pool tables, drinking fountains, concrete buggies and numerous other articles of war surplus property go on sale Tuesday at the air station.

Only a veteran with a certificate will be allowed in the hangar where the sale will take place on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, Randy Jenness, chief of information division, WAA, explained today. Veterans without certificates may apply for them Friday and Saturday.

Nothing in the nature of automotive equipment will go on sale until March 8, Jenness advised. It will be on the veteran set-aside list and veterans need only to show their discharge papers at the sale to qualify for purchasing.

W. H. Galloway, chief of the veterans division, WAA, arrived in Klamath Falls today, Monday, to consult with Ted Case, American Legion service officer.

Galloway will meet tonight at 8 o'clock with representatives of veterans organizations and explain how they can buy for members of their organization. The meeting will be held in the selective service offices of Klamath county courthouse. Veterans will be passed through the hangar by their certificates and may look over the merchandise on display before buying. Three order desks will be operating and a crew of 20 WAA workers will be on duty to assist in sales. Federal agencies may exercise their ordering priorities Tuesday also, but they will do no heavy buying, Jenness predicted.

Case reported that the majority of applicants were prospective users of surplus property rather than those purchasing for re-sale.

George A. Hanscome, WAA chief of location sales, in charge of the entire sale at the air station, will be on hand throughout negotiations. Material left over from the sale will be auctioned off to highest bidders at end of sale.
