Sealed proposals will be received by the Common Council of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, for the purchase of street improvement bonds, Series 77 and 78, aggregating Fourteen Thousand, Four Hundred Seventy-one Dollars (\$14,471.00), duly authorized by ordinance of the said City of Klamath Falls, for the construction and improvement of the following improvement units situated in Klamath Falls, Oregon, as follows:

Improvement unit No. 80, extending along Main Street from South Line of Main Street to the North Line of Home Avenue; and Improvement Unit No. 91, extending along Michigan Avenue from the North Line of Main Street to the South-Eastern line of the U. S. R. S. Canal right-of-way from the Northeastern line of Michigan Avenue to the Southwestern line of the U. S. R. S. Canal right-of-way.
