ELMENDORF FIELD, Alaska, Feb. 26 (AP)—The second Alaskan air command B-29 lost in less than a week on training missions was feared down today somewhere on or near the Alaska peninsula, possibly in the vicinity of the Valley of Ten Thousand Smokes.

Brig. Gen. Joseph H. Atkinson, commanding general, announced the last report from the missing ship placed it near Bruin pass, on the mainland area of the peninsula north of Kodiak island. The number of men

Officials See Drop In Pork Price

WASHINGTON, Feb. 26 (AP)—The agriculture department today discounted talk of \$1-a-pound pork chops with an assertion that housewives won't stand for it.

Skyrocketing hog prices merely reflect a seasonal decline in marketable animals, said Charles L. Harlan, department livestock price specialist.

And he told a reporter he expects consumer resistance—which means housewives with their dander up—to force a downturn in those prices soon.

Department economists held to their contention that food price levels reached their post-war peak last October, after most government controls were removed.

"It is possible that prices during the first half of the year may hold their own, or increase very slightly," said James P. Cavin, farm and food price economist. "But we see no possibility of their climbing back to anywhere near the peak of last October."

Some foods already have declined in cost since the first of the year and further decreases are expected. In this class are fluid milk, butter, cheese, evaporated milk, dry milk, eggs, poultry, fresh and frozen fish, fresh and processed vegetables, and canned fruits.

The pass is also about 100 miles southeast of Naknek, fishing community on the arm of Bristol bay, near the famed Mount Katmai area.

The plane's gas supply should have been exhausted at about 8:20 A. M. T. (PST) yesterday and it was declared missing as of that hour, General Atkinson said.

Normally, a plane on a training mission carries approximately 12 men. The Superfortress from Ladd field, Fairbanks, which was forced down in northern Greenland last Friday had 11 men aboard.

Improved flying weather was hoped for today to aid in the search of the rugged, little-inhabited area. All Alaska air search agencies were alerted.

The Bruin Pass area is about 300 to 350 miles southwest of Elmendorf field, the Alaskan air command headquarters located four miles from Anchorage.

The heroic rescue two days ago of the Ladd field fliers in northern Greenland after their 46th long range reconnaissance squadron plane the "Kee Bird" was blown off its course last Friday and ran out of gas, encouraged leaders searching the latest missing plane. Crew members of the "Kee Bird" were resting at Westover field, Mass., before returning to Alaska.

The pilot who rescued the 11 men, Lt. Bobbie Joe Cavnar, 22, Okmulgee, Okla., and his five crewmen were decorated at Washington, D. C., yesterday by Gen. Carl Spaatz, head of the army air forces. Cavnar was given the Distinguished Flying Cross and his crewmen each received the Air Medal. Lieutenant Cavnar landed the rescue ship, the C-54, on a frozen surface without the aid of winter equipment and took off with the rescued crew safely, aided by rockets.

Typhoid Fever Increases In State

PORTLAND, Feb. 26 (AP)—The state board of health, reporting an increase in typhoid fever cases, today urged greater attention to water supply and sewage disposal facilities.

The board recorded 68 typhoid cases in Oregon last year, and 12 so far this year—well above the 48 cases of 1944 and the 41 of 1945.

Diphtheria, however, dropped sharply last year—an improvement attributed by the board of health to more immunization.

Oregon Pioneer Author Passes

OREGON CITY, Feb. 26 (AP)—Mrs. Eva Emery Dye, 91, author of several books on early Oregon pioneers, died here yesterday.

A native of Illinois, she graduated from Oberlin college in 1882 and came to Oregon City 57 years ago.

She wrote "McLoughlin and Old Oregon" in 1900, followed it with her best known work, "The Conquest, the True Story of Lewis and Clark" in 1902. Her last book was "Soul of America, An Oregon Illiad," published in 1934.

after the eruption of Mount Katmai in June, 1912. Thousands of steam jets, intensely hot, burst through the floor of the valley and the "explosion" of Mount Katmai was reported by scientists to be one of the largest ever known.

Expeditions of the National Geographic Society discovered many of the valley's wonders and it was set aside as the Katmai national monument in 1918.

Liquor Sale Local Problem

PORTLAND, Feb. 26 (AP)—Federal District Judge Claude McColloch said yesterday that charges brought against whites for selling liquor to Indians were wasting the taxpayers' money.

The judge said the offense could best be dealt with in local courts, and after placing Harry Berry, 55, Pendleton, on 30-day probation, he ordered the U. S. marshal's office to see that Berry was returned to Pendleton at government expense.

Berry was taken out of a hospital to be brought to Portland and stand trial for selling wine to a Umatilla tribesman. The court observed the defendant, who pleaded guilty, should never have been removed from the hospital.

Federal Court Clerk Ross de Motte said a check of court dockets indicated 50 per cent of district court cases here involved charges of sale of liquor to Indians.
