

Beavers Choose To Hold Tourney At Corvallis

Now that Oregon State has won the northern division title, the Beavers have squelched talk of transplanting the conference championship series like the 1942 Rose Bowl game.

This time the transfer would have been only 40 miles to the south — to the University of Oregon's McArthur court, better known by profile as the Igloo, which holds 2000 fans compared with about 800 at Oregon State's court.

But the Beavers will hold

the series with the southern division representative at Corvallis March 7, 8 and 10 with only 700 seats going to the general public.

The southern division representative is almost certain to be UCLA, a team that has established a new conference scoring record of 85 points in a single game and has averaged 55 points through the season.

Stars are: No. 1, Don Barksdale, 6-foot 8-inch, 200-pound center who holds the nation's scoring record of 1288 points in a season, nearly 24 points a game

(established while with the army Camp Ross team; No. 2, Davage Miner, a 6-foot-3, 195-pound guard, who sometimes outscored Barksdale and like the center is of African ancestry; No. 3, John Stanich, a 5-foot-10 forward, who currently is leading scorers in conference games down south and is of European ancestry.

Coach Wilbur Jones of UCLA, who was at Washington State to scout the Oregon State team, thinks highly of both Barksdale and Miner. They have so much spring in their legs that neither tosses the ball up to the basket

—“They jump up and thump the ball down through the hoop,” he swears.

Oregon State's Red Rocha can do that, too, and has paced the Beavers to a conference scoring average of 61 points a game, slightly above the UCLA mark. Rocha, almost certain to be the northern division scoring leader again this year, will give away pounds to Barksdale, but at 6 feet 8 has two inches in height.

The Beavers also have darling Lew Beck, only 5 feet 10, but a floor leader capable of 20-point

efforts. His replacement, Dan Torrey, is as likely to get hot in a scoring spree — Coach Slat Gills rates Torrey the best freshman player he ever has had. And then there's Morrie Silver, the 5-foot-8 guard, whose slick floor play helps make the Staters the team they are.

There is more height in Erland Anderson and Alex Peterson, both plus six-footers who get their share of points.

Not many will see it, but it's going to be quite a series.

Martin Lashes At "Subversionists"
PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 26 (AP)—America's businessmen and workers must strike out at “subversionists” in order to keep the country “safe, sound, solvent and secure,” says Joseph W. Martin Jr., speaker of the U. S. house of representatives.

The Massachusetts republican told the 38th annual meeting of

the Pennsylvania Manufacturers association last night that subversionists seek to “destroy our American system of government, economy and society” by setting up “a centralized government, with a false form of communism, and the heart and purpose of a communistic or fascist despotism.”

Strain Off, Oregon State Loses To Cougars, 49-37

PULLMAN, Wash., Feb. 26 (AP)—A let-up by the Oregon State Beavers, new northern division Pacific coast conference basketball titleholders, gave Washington State college a 49 to 37 victory last night.

Playing with two regulars missing, Oregon State moved

ahead to lead at halftime 24-21, but were unable to withstand Washington State's closing drive. Oregon State clinched the title Monday night against Washington State, but Erland Anderson and Alex Peterson, starting OSC players, were injured and did not get into last night's game.

The loss, Oregon State's third conference beating of the season and fourth of the year, left them with a 12-won, three-loss conference record, with one game to play. The victory gave Washington State a 10-won, five-loss record in the conference, with one game to go.

Morrie Silver, Oregon State guard, and Gene Sivertson, Washington State center, shared scoring honors with 11 apiece.
