Women of Klamath county home extension units are the first in Oregon to contribute toward the projected \$45,000 Azalea House fund.

Azalea House will be a cooperative type home for women students on the campus of Oregon State College, Corvallis. Mrs. Lee Holliday, building fund chairman for the county extension committee, announced last week that Klamath county has placed \$166 at the disposal of the board of trustees for the house. This is the first county to come forward with such a sum, according to Mrs. Holliday.

The venture will be financed entirely by voluntary efforts of homemakers throughout the state. Five trustees are in charge of the fund.

Mrs. Earl Mack, co-chairman of the building fund committee with Mrs. Holliday, said that students will be selected for house privileges each year on the basis of leadership, scholarship and need for economical housing.

Construction is expected to begin in 1949. Any interested person or firm may contribute and such gifts may be sent to Mrs. Holliday, post office box 48, Klamath Falls.

The name for the house was chosen in a state-wide contest, and is in honor of Mrs. Azalea Sager, state home demonstration leader, and also for the wildflower which grows prolifically in the Willamette valley and coastal counties.

Receipt of funds has been acknowledged from Rice Motors, Henry Thorsen barber shop, G. B. Schaefer service station, Weyerhaeuser Timber company, Blanche Richardson, Lein's store, Carl Frei service station, Hiway cafe and anonymous donors. Units having already contributed are Altamont, Bly, Bonanza, Chiloquin, Fairhaven, Klamath Falls, Poe Valley-Olene and Shasta-Homedale. Money has been raised through gift sales, carnivals, chili suppers and bazaars.

Peaster Estate Valued At Ten Thousand Dollars

George Holmes Peaster, 41, who was one of the five victims of the tragic Evans apartment fire of February 18, left an estate valued at in excess of \$10,000, according to probate filings.

The estate includes a half interest in the Klamath Variety store on Main street, Peaster and his wife, Jean, 38, who also died in the fire, owned the store jointly with E. M. Alspaugh of Seattle.

Probate of the Peaster estate brought out a little-used point of law, in that in case of death of a husband and wife, when time of deaths cannot be determined, the husband is assumed to have outlived the wife.

In this instance, since both Mr. and Mrs. Peaster died in the fire, the man is assumed to have died last.

Sole heir of the Peasters is their 19-year-old daughter, Betty Jean. The United States National Bank of Portland was named as administrator.

Peaster's partner, Alspaugh, in asking that the bank be appointed administrator of the estate, said that he had an agreement to buy out Peaster's share of the local business in the event of his partner's death, for 50 per cent of the true value of the business at the time of death.

The option is good for 30 days, and Alspaugh asked for an immediate appraisal of the value of the Klamath Variety store in order to exercise his option.

Mantz To Try For New Speed Record
LOS ANGELES, Feb. 26 (AP)—An assault on the trans-continental airplane speed record is planned by Paul Mantz, 43, veteran flyer, starting at 4 a. m. Sunday with LaGuardia field, New York, his destination.

Mantz, who won last year's Bendix race, said he would fly a P-51 Mustang at 30,000 feet or higher.

The record for conventionally powered planes of 6 hours, 31 minutes, 30 seconds, was set by Col. C. A. Peterson, also flying a P-51, May 12, 1944.

Harney Estate Valued At \$4000
Mrs. Golda V. Harney, 55, one of the Evans apartment fire victims, left an estate valued at \$4000, according to probate filings, and also left an unsigned, undated, hand-written will.

Her heirs are her son, Jack Harney of Medford, and daughter, Norah E. Gandee, Menlo Park, Calif. Jack Harney was named administrator.

The estate is to be divided between her son and daughter, except for a few specific bequests to other relatives listed in the unsigned will. Those bequests were items of personal property, and are believed to have been consumed by the fire.
