## Vet Loans May Be Tax Deduction

World War II veterans who have obtained loans under the GI bill will get a double break on any federal income tax they have to pay, Patrick W. Kilby, Veterans Administration representative in this area, explained today.

The four per cent gratuity payment which the VA credits to an ex-serviceman on the guaranteed portion of a GI loan is exempt from the federal tax, under an internal revenue bureau ruling. In addition, all interest which the veteran pays on his loan may be deducted from income, whether or not the VA gratuity actually paid any of the interest.
