EUGENE, Ore., March 5 (AP)—Gustav H. Hall, 57, former Junction City farmer, was killed late yesterday near Oakridge when pinned to his parked automobile by a skidding car driven by a San Pedro, Calif., woman.

Deputy Coroner Phil Bartholomew reported Mrs. Maude Smith, 69, driver of the northbound car, said another automobile started to pass her car from behind. She applied the brakes

and her auto went into a skid, crushing Hall.

Bartholomew said Hall, whose wife, daughter and three grandchildren were in his car and trailer, had stopped to put chains on his own vehicle. He recently sold his farm and was en route to San Diego, Calif., to make his home.

Professor Freed On Spy Charge
OTTAWA, March 5 (AP)—Israel Halperin, former Queen's university mathematics professor and ex-army major, was acquitted yesterday of charges of conspiring to communicate confidential information to Russia. Halperin, 31, was the 17th defendant to stand trial since the espionage probe started here a year ago.

So far seven defendants have been acquitted, 10 have been sentenced. Two have vanished and one—Dr. Raymond Boyer of McGill university—is awaiting trial.

Indo-China Head Ousted

PARIS, March 5 (AP)—Adm. Georges Thierry D'Argenlieu was ousted by the French cabinet today as high commissioner for war-torn Indo-China.

Emile Bollaert, former prefect of the Rhone region, will replace him.

Adm. D'Argenlieu, whose position has been under attack since Viet-Nam groups began large-scale attacks on Hanoi December 19, did not resign, cabinet informants said.

Recently returned from Saigon, under order from the French government, to engage in "consultations" on the status of Indo-China's troubles, which flared after the breakdown of negotiations between Viet-Nam delegates and the French at Versailles a year ago.

Western Task Groups End Antarctic Exploration

ABOARD THE U.S.S. MT. OLYMPUS, March 5 (AP)—Capt. Charles Bond's western task group ended its polar exploration operations last night, completing all activities of the greatest expedition ever made to the Antarctic.

Ships in the eastern and central groups of the navy expedition led by Admiral Richard E. Byrd already have started the homeward trip.

The western task group's three Martin seaplanes made 25 photographic mapping flights while the mother ship, the Currituck, steamed 300 miles around the coast of Antarctica. The planes photographed 385,000 square miles in an area much of which was never charted before.

Ships of the western and eastern task groups came within 400 to 500 miles of meeting and, counting their plane flights, almost circumnavigated the south polar continent.

Expedition officials said Bond's group had a gap of only about 200 to 250 miles in the area of the Leopold and Astrid coast in its photographic coverage over its 3600-mile route. Its activities were halted before a new visit could be made to Bunge's oasis—an unexplained area of unfrozen lakes inland on the continent.

The western group is en route to Snyder wharf, the eastern group, which started northward Monday is to visit Rio De Janeiro for six days on the return trip, arriving there about March 18.
