Secretary of State Marshall—now en route to Moscow—has expressed doubt that the foreign ministers of France, Britain, Russia and America can write a German treaty at their forthcoming conference in the Soviet capital.

That's a disquieting (though not surprising) preview, because the rehabilitation of chaotic Europe hangs on the early conclusion of a constructive German treaty.

Of course we should recognize that, as General Marshall says, the negotiations will be "extremely difficult."

U. S. Raps Soviet Move

WASHINGTON, March 6 (AP)—The United States today charged Soviet Russia with causing a political crisis by an "unjustified interference" in Hungarian internal affairs.

A sharp note, delivered to the Russian, British and Hungarian governments, and to the Soviet military commander in Budapest, said that the Soviet high command by direct intervention has brought political difficulties in Hungary to a crisis.

An official summary of the note handed Moscow as Secretary of State Marshall traveled toward the Soviet capital, said it is government deems "unwarranted" charges filed against Parliamentary Deputy Bela Kovacs, who was arrested last week by Russian soldiers.
