Employees are eligible to join the profit-sharing fund after one year of service. Of 36 Klamath Falls members, the group has an aggregate investment of \$36,339.18 including Sears stock and \$7854.48 cash balance. Employee members of the fund contribute 3 per cent of their salaries into individual accounts each year up to \$250. Company contributions to the fund this year ranged from \$1.27 for each dollar deposited by employees with less than five years of service to \$5.08 per dollar for those over 50 years of age with 15 years of service.
