## Teachers Stay On The Job

BREMERTON, March 7 (AP)—Bremerton school teachers remained at their desks today after voting overwhelmingly to heed a telegraph appeal by six state legislators to "carefully consider" their strike action.

Harold Paschal, president of the AFL-Teachers' federation, said the union voted 199 to 23 to indefinitely postpone the strike which had been called as of the start of school today.

"The matter now rests squarely with the state legislature as to whether or not we will strike," Paschal said.

The strike, which would have closed down the high school, two junior high schools and 13 elementary schools with a total attendance of about 7100, was called Wednesday night to protest what the union termed the legislature's "stalling" on measures to increase teachers' salaries.
