HOLLYWOOD, Calif., March 10 (AP)—Victory Pote, 37, pioneer film actor and one of the original Keystone Cops, died Saturday night. He was born in Lafayette, Ind.

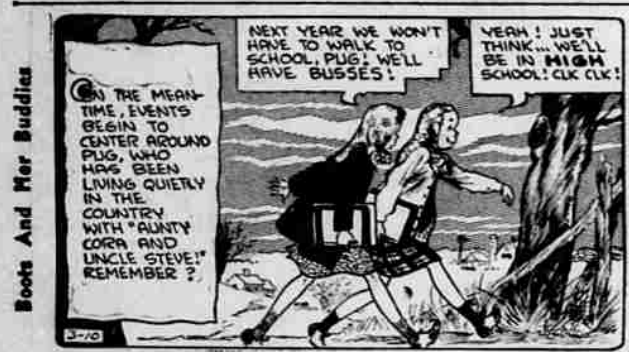

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Solons Ask Mexican Stay
WASHINGTON, March 10 (AP)—California congressmen Saturday urged the immigration service to be lenient with Mexican "wetbacks" pending ratification of a new contract with Mexico for the importation of farm workers.

"Wetbacks" are those Mexicans who enter the United States illegally, presumably by swimming the Rio Grande.

Rep. Phillips (R-Calif.) declared it would be a waste of public funds and cause hardship to farmers to deport Mexicans already working in the fields, only to bring them back later when the contract, now under negotiation, goes into effect.

Phillips expressed his views at a conference of California congressmen with Uga Carusi, immigration commissioner.

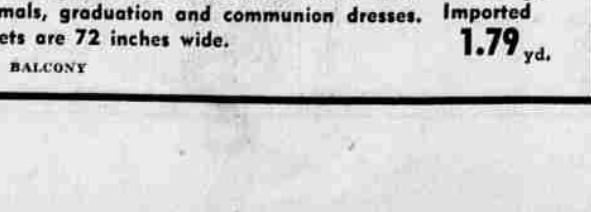
The congressmen volunteered their assistance in "hurrying up" the procedures for putting the farm labor agreement into effect.

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Soviets Lift Censorship
NEW YORK, March 10 (AP)—Both United States press correspondents and radio reporters in Moscow noted today that the Soviet Union was living up to a pledge not to censor news of the four-power foreign ministers' conference.

John M. Hightower of the Associated Press reported that Russia "officially lifted censorship of conference copy today, and the heaviest file of unscreened stories in modern times was pouring from Moscow to the world." He said non-conference news still was being censored.

The National Broadcasting company reported that its correspondent, Henry C. Cassidy, yesterday spoke on "the first uncensored broadcast ever made from the Soviet Union."

U. S. newspapers and news agencies yesterday received conference dispatches only about two hours after they were filed in Moscow—against the seven or eight hours Moscow copy often has taken to get past censors and radio operators to this country.

Flashes Of Life

BOYHOOD SOUVENIR
CATSKILL, N. Y., March 10 (AP)—A trip to the dentist uncovered a 25-year-old mystery for Sgt. Paul Kelly of the Catskill police department.

X-rays revealed a piece of metal in Kelly's jaw. After probing, the dentist removed a B-B shot.

Kelly could not recall ever having been shot, but an older brother remembered that Paul had gotten in the way of a B-B shot when playing "cops and robbers" more than 25 years ago.

FOR WANT OF A LADDER
KANSAS CITY, March 10 (AP)—Firemen at No. 29 station had to turn in an alarm for help in putting out a small blaze at their own firehouse.

A motorist discovered the blaze yesterday under the eaves of the two-story building, and the firemen found they needed a ladder. But they had none. Their's was a pumper station.

So, reluctantly, the firemen rang the gong, and four companies raced to their aid—bringing ladders.

Concentration Camp Trial Stated
NUERNBERG, Germany, Mar. 10 (AP)—Oswald Pohl, who was executive manager of the chain of concentration camps set up by Heinrich Himmler, and 17 of his aides pleaded innocent today to charges of crimes against humanity.

American prosecutors presented the indictment of the SS (elite guard) business administration at a formal arraignment before a four-man U. S. court.

The group was charged with establishing and maintaining torture camps which grew from a few well-known places like Dachau and Oranienburg to hundreds of stockades where inmates were virtual slaves.

The trial was scheduled tentatively to begin in two weeks.

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Sugar Stamp Good April 1
WASHINGTON, March 10 (AP)—The office of temporary controls announced today that spare stamp No. 11 in OPA family ration books will become good April 1 for 10 pounds of sugar.

Validation of the 10-pound stamp will mark OPA's change-over from the 5-pound ration procedure for household users. The current stamp, No. 53, good for five pounds, will expire March 31.

Stamp No. 11 will be good through September 30 but OPA said a second stamp good for 10 pounds will be validated July 1 providing sugar imports meet expectations.

OPA officials said it is possible that still another 10 pounds, bringing the year's total for household users to 35, may be made available September 30.

OPA emphasized that new stamps being validated include sugar for both regular home and canning use. No separate stamps will be issued for canning. Last year household users got 15 pounds of sugar for regular use and 10 for home canning.
