

# "The Best Years Of Our Lives" And "The Yearling" Favored For Oscar Award

HOLLYWOOD, March 13 (AP)—Hollywood is supposed to be used to climatic moments, but those coming up tonight when the Oscars are presented have Hollywood agog, as usual. Little else was discussed today except who will get the awards for last year's best film performances. Everyone seems to believe Olivia de Havilland will win out over Celia Johnson, Jennifer Jones, Rosalind Russell and Jane Wyman for her work in "To Each His Own." Fredric March appears to have the edge as the best actor, for "The Best Years of Our Lives," although Laurence Olivier is considered by many to be a strong contender, not only because he acted in the English-made "Henry V," but because he produced and directed it.

## Miner Suffers Axe Attack

CRESCENT CITY, Calif., March 13 (AP)—Undersheriff William Mooney said today William J. Langiewicz, a miner, was hacked about the head with an axe and seriously wounded by an itinerant odd jobs man he had befriended. The attack occurred early yesterday and Oregon police officers trailed the assailant deep into the remote Winchuck river area of the Siskiyou National forest. A posse of 15 California and Oregon men with bloodhounds continued the search today, Williams said. Williams said Langiewicz, who was working a mine in the Hard Scabble creek area north of here, awoke under the blows yesterday. The miner was brought to a hospital here. The undersheriff said the assailant fled with Langiewicz's effects and automobile, but the car stalled as an attempt was made to ford the Winchuck river. The man then proceeded on foot.

## Businessmen Asked To Aid Guard Move

SALEM, March 13 (AP)—Business men were asked by Acting Adjutant General Raymond F. Olson to assist in the drive to fill Oregon's quota of 12,058 national guardsmen. General Olson announced the drive would begin immediately. He returned yesterday from attending a conference of adjutants general in Washington, D. C. He said businessmen would give a great incentive to the recruiting drive if they would give employees time off in the summer to attend national guard training camps.

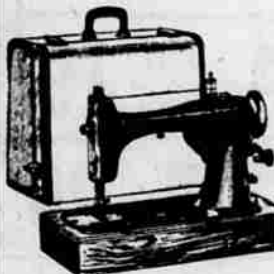

Joan Crawford and Ray Milland, last year's winners, will present the Oscars to the best actress and actor. It is expected that the climax to movieland's biggest annual affair will be reached about 11 p. m. (PST).

## Enjoy oranges these new ways



**ORANGE PASTRY**—Try this with lemon or lime chiffon pie, or use it as the crust for a fresh fruit pie. And it gives a delightfully different flavor to pumpkin pie. Sift and measure 2 cups all-purpose flour. Sift again with 1/2 teaspoon salt. Cut 1/2 cup shortening into flour with 2 knives or pastry blender until particles are the size of small peas. Add gradually 4 to 5 tablespoons orange juice and 1 teaspoon grated orange rind, mixing only until pastry holds together. Wrap in waxed paper; chill thoroughly. Sufficient for two 9-inch shells or one 2-crust 9-inch pie.

**ORANGE GOLD PARSHIPS**—Simmer 6 medium-size parsnips in water to cover until tender, about 25 minutes. Drain and cool. Peel and cut lengthwise strips, removing any tough cores. Place in a greased 2-quart baking dish; sprinkle with 1/4 cup brown sugar, salt, pepper and paprika. Pour 1/2 cup orange juice over the parsnips and dot with butter or margarine. Cover and bake in a moderate oven (350° F.) 30 minutes. Garnish with orange slices. Serves 6.
