Sealed proposals will be received by the Common Council of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, for the purchase of street improvement bonds, Series 70, aggregating Eight Thousand, Four Hundred, Twenty-two and 80/100 Dollars (\$8,422.20), duly authorized by ordinance of the said City of Klamath Falls, for the construction and improvement of the following improvement unit situated in Klamath Falls, Oregon, as follows:

IMPROVEMENT UNIT NO. 92, extending along Doty Street from the South Line of Urban Street to the Southwestern Line of No. 7th Street and No. 7th Street from the Southwestern line of Doty Street to the Southeastern line of Mt. Whitney Street.

WASHINGTON STATE COLLEGE, Pullman, March 14—All persons interested in promotion and improvement of wood manufacturing and utilization in the Pacific northwest are being invited to join in the second annual wood products clinic in Spokane, March 24 and 25, reports E. B. Parker, acting director of WSC's division of industrial research.

The WSC-sponsored gathering will immediately precede the inter-mountain logging conference, booked to follow at the Davenport hotel, and it is expected to have representatives from Washington, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, British Columbia, Wyoming, Colorado and elsewhere.

Dean D. S. Jeffers, head of the school of forestry at the University of Idaho, is the chairman of the program committee, while other members are R. T. Bowling, Potlatch Forests, Inc., Lewiston, Idaho; I. V. Anderson, forest utilization service, Missoula, Mont.; Dean K. R. Pugh, St. Maries Lumber company, St. Maries, Ida., and Director Parker.

The opening panel, running both Monday morning and afternoon, will be devoted to "Improved Manufacturing Practices" and will be under chairmanship of Harold White, Potlatch Forests, Inc., Lewiston, Ida.

Among the group of lumbermen who will participate in the panel discussion is W. C. Strong of the Weyerhaeuser Timber company in Klamath Falls. On Tuesday morning the subject will be "Waste Utilization," and the closing panel on Tuesday afternoon will be "Round Timber Production and Merchandising."

Jap Prison Ship Guards On Trial

YOKOHAMA, March 14 (AP)—Lt. Jansaburo Toshino and eight others, all wartime guards aboard Japanese prison ships on which more than 1300 allied troops died en route to Japan, went on trial here Wednesday. All pleaded innocent to the charges of atrocity.

Toshino, the principal defendant, was charged with ordering the beheading of some prisoners in the Philippines and with shooting down others aboard the prison ship Oryoku Maru after the vessel was bombed.

235,000 Cows On Oregon Farms Now

PORTLAND, March 14 (AP)—Oregon farmers milked 235,000 cows last year, producing about 1,325,000 pounds of milk, a 7 per cent decline from 1945, the department of agriculture estimated today.

The USDA crop reporting service said Oregon's 1946 milk production was the lowest in 12 years, although the output per cow was better than average. Herds were heavily culled to eliminate poor milkers.
