

Midwest Hit By Sudden Cold Wave

CHICAGO, March 15 (AP)—Winter was back in the midwest today. Sub-normal temperatures prevailed over the entire central portion of the country, and the weather bureau said the cold spell would last for several days.

(Meantime the west coast had above normal temperatures. San Francisco's 75.7 yesterday was the warmest March 14 since 1927. Los Angeles at 87 had its hottest March 14 in weather bureau records, and Seattle's 68 was a near-record.)

The chilly weather overspread the midwest from the plains states southward to Texas and eastward through the Mississippi and Ohio valleys and Great Lakes region. It was expected to move slowly eastward, with diminishing intensity.

Some representative overnight minimum temperatures included:

Glasgow, Mont., -17; Pembina, N. D., -1; Havre, Mont., -3; Moberly, Mo., -7; Amarillo, Tex., -20; North Platte, Neb., -12; Concordia, Kas., -21; Des Moines, Ia., -15; Alexandria, Minn., -9; Wausau, Wis., -15; Marquette, Mich., -18; Springfield, Ill., -20; Indianapolis, Ind., -16; and Columbia, Mo., -21.

Portal Pay Challenged

WASHINGTON, March 15 (AP)—Senate Republicans striving to beat off proposed changes in a bill to outlaw portal pay suits heard a challenge of its constitutionality from their own ranks today.

Senator Aiken (R-Vt.) told a reporter he "doesn't see how" congress could pass a law "retroactively barring any legitimate claims" for back wages. Suits are pending for nearly \$6,000,000.

"There is a question of constitutionality there," Aiken said. "I have got to be convinced the bill would not outlaw bona fide claims before I vote for it."

Aiken raised the same point on the senate floor yesterday as debate on the antiportal pay legislation got under way.

"What I am wondering," he told Senator Donnell (R-Mo.), "is how you are going to outlaw so-called nuisance suits and not at the same time outlaw legitimate claims."

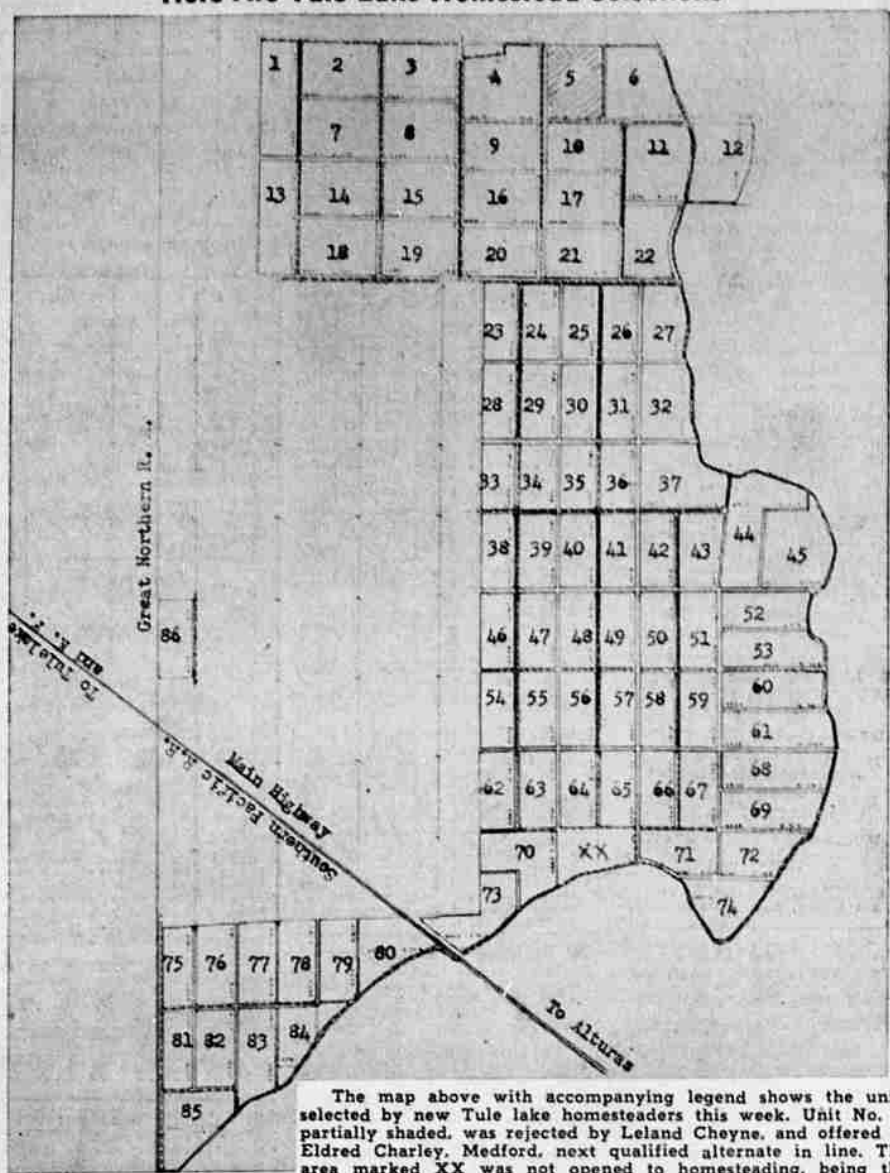

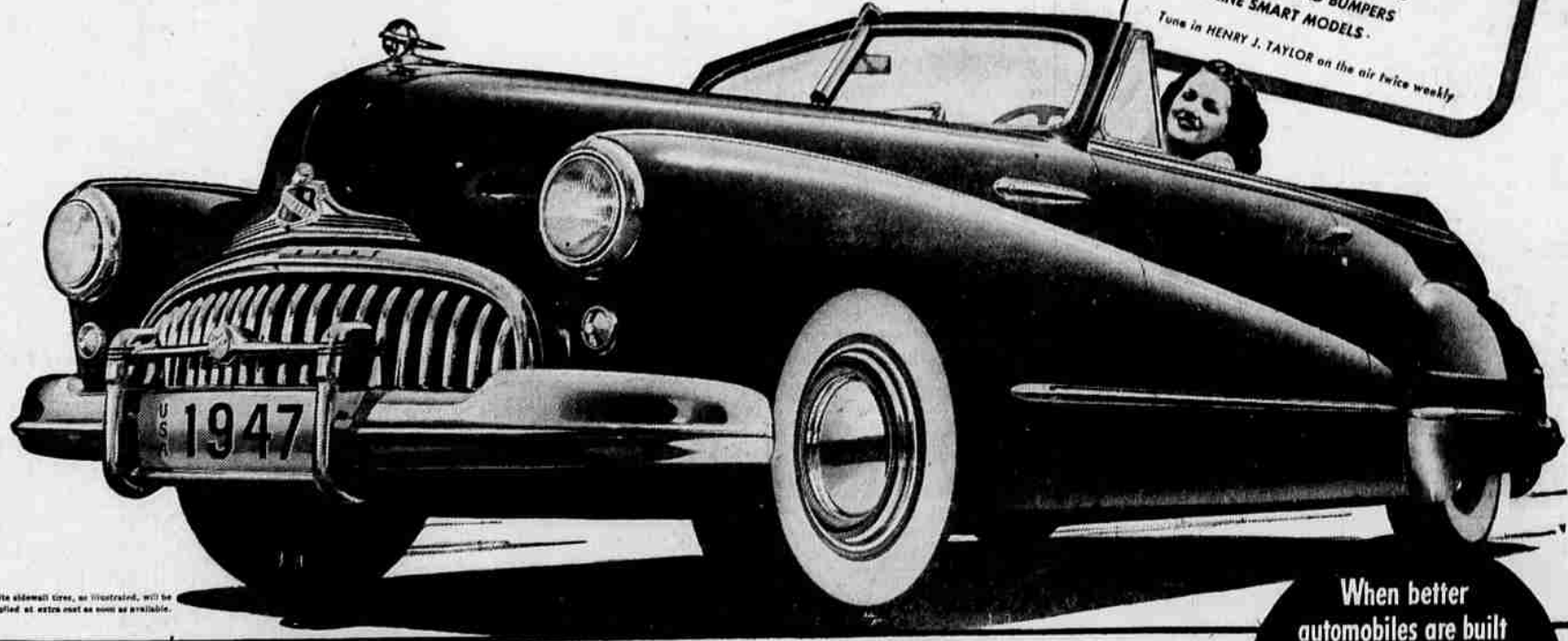
