

KC Initiation Slated Here

Air Search To Be Made

The newly-organized Klamath Air Search and Rescue unit will take off on its initial search this Wednesday in an effort to locate two planes missing in this area. The missing aircraft are the four-place, single engine Navion, lost in a flight from Los Angeles to Beaverton on February 16 and piloted by Douglas Locke, and the single engine army surplus craft flown by Robert Rubottom of McMinnville, missing on a flight from Klamath Falls to McMinnville January 16.

Ray Royce, president of the search group, said today that members will meet in the main hangar at the airport Tuesday at 7:30 p. m. to formulate plans for their first venture. Organization of air and ground crews will be completed and squadron commanders selected. All details of Wednesday's flight will be worked out at the session.
