

GI Bill Of Rights Covers Every Field Of Education

Under the GI bill of rights, Oregon's World War II veterans can study for just about any profession or vocation they choose, from medicine to music, from banking to barbering.

A directory of educational institutions approved by the Oregon state department of public instruction for the veterans administration, and distributed to veterans' organizations, and county service officers by Director George E. Sandy of the department of veterans' affairs, lists more than 165 public and private institutions of learning in Oregon which ex-servicemen may attend at government expense. The list does not include grade and high schools, which are generally approved.

Does your husband, recently discharged from the army, aspire to become another Winchell or Graham MacNamee? He can go to one of two radio announcing schools in Portland approved by the VA.

Has he terpsichorean aspirations? Four dancing schools to teach the art of dance instruction are on the list. If music is his yen, then send him to his choice of five approved studios, at least one of which teaches singing.

Oregon should have plenty of aviators and airplane mechanics, because a total of 44 institutions scattered throughout the state are approved to teach these subjects.

WAVE seeking professional knowledge, there are 13 hospitals that offer nursing, and eight beauty schools, plus 28 business colleges and banking institutes for either sex.

Attlee Criticizes Montgomery Speech

LONDON, March 20 (AP)—Prime Minister Attlee hinted today that he had scolded Field Marshal Lord Montgomery.

"I have spoken to Field Marshal Montgomery telling him of the danger of making speeches which might be interpreted by persons who wanted to make mischief," Attlee said in the house of commons.

Lord Montgomery, non-party chief of the imperial general staff, said in a speech last week it was vital that Great Britain have able leadership "at all levels in every walk of life."

Conservatives interpreted this as critical of the labor government during the current economic crisis.

Senate Talks Sugar Ration

WASHINGTON, March 20 (AP)—The senate GOP policy committee will hear arguments for and against sugar rationing and price ceilings in a meeting tomorrow which Chairman Taft (Ohio) hopes will speed a decision before present controls expire March 31.

The senate banking committee has approved a bill to continue the controls another year under the secretary of agriculture.

But Senator McCarthy (R-Wis.), who with Senator Bricker (R-Ohio), has introduced a measure to end rationing immediately, told reporters he plans to appear at a conference of all sen-

ate republicans Saturday morning to seek unified backing for his own proposal. This bill would continue price controls.

Training School Revision Talked

CHEHALIS, Wash., March 20 (AP)—A five-point program, headed by the need of additional facilities, was recommended today by the legislative interim committee following its investigation of unrest at the boys' training school.

Additional facilities, which the four-man committee suggested could be financed from an \$8,000,000 appropriation placed at the disposal of Governor Wallgren for capital outlays for state institutions, included at least three cottages, a new administration building, a new hospital and a segregation center.

CORVALLIS, March 20 (AP)—The annual irrigation water forecast meetings for eastern and southern Oregon will open March 29 at The Dalles, W. T. Frost, hydraulic engineer for the soil conservation service, reported today.
