

Airline Books Show Decrease

United Air Lines showed a sharp decrease in net income in 1948, according to a financial report received from the office of the company which operates Klamath's major air line connection.

Net income, after taxes, was \$1,086,061, equivalent to 54 cents per share of stock outstanding, as contrasted with \$4,203,815 in 1945.

Increase in operating revenues occurred in the year, but these were more than offset in sharply rising costs. United's operating income hit \$84,948,159, a gain of 83 per cent over 1945. But operating expenses mounted to \$82,474,030, an increase of 97 per cent over the previous year.

President W. A. Patterson told stockholders in his annual report that United has taken definite steps to finance new facilities which future traffic volume will require. Total amount of

Western Air Lines Plans New Service

Western Air Lines, which has arranged to sell its Denver-Los Angeles route to United Air Lines, is developing plans for service to the northwest as soon as CAB approval is given, according to T. C. Drinkwater, president.

He said Western plans to devote all of its efforts to development of the territory between the Rocky mountains and the Pacific coast. He said that the sale of the Denver-LA route makes it possible for Western to concentrate its program in the west, and will develop a north-south pattern of service.

Western, the president of the line said, is a "carrier born in the west, owned in the west, and serving the west. That is our basic premise."

Dispatcher's Office Moved

Removal of the dispatchers' office of the Southern Pacific back to Dunsmuir was completed here March 15, and 12 employees and their families returned to the northern California rail center since February 1, 1944. The dispatchers' office was moved here as a wartime measure. Involved in the move were three chief dispatchers and nine trick dispatchers. W. P. Petty was day chief and in charge of the first trick, Lawrence Campbell, second trick, and Albert A. Gunn, third trick.

Campbell has not yet made the move to Dunsmuir as he continues to receive medical care at his home following critical injuries received in a recent automobile accident while en route home from Dunsmuir on a business trip.

From now on, according to Lloyd S. Stitt, district freight and passenger agent, all dispatching will come out of Dunsmuir. An operator has been left here, however, to take train

orders. All train orders will be made up in Dunsmuir and transmitted here by the dispatcher to Klamath Falls for various trains originating or passing through here.

Shipping Quiet

Southern Pacific sources report shipping fairly quiet at this time with the first reported feeder livestock from the Red Bluff-Cottonwood area due in around April 15. From that date on, livestock shipments are expected to be heavy as cattle returns north for summer pasture.

Shortage of cars for potato shipments has held up 50 per cent of the normal shipping demand, Stitt advised today. Lumber remains the big shipping item but a change in the potato market and advantageous condition of cars available, will up potato shipments soon.

Another Great Northern job exchange occurred this week when J. F. Lee, formerly the GN cashier at the local freight station, was promoted to chief clerk in the traffic department.
