

Committee Democrats Oppose Cut

WASHINGTON, March 21 (AP)—Democratic members of the House Ways and Means committee decided today to oppose any tax reduction plans proposed by Republicans or anyone else at this time.

They met with Democratic Floor Leader Sam Rayburn as the republican-controlled committee went into session to approve a bill calling for a 30 per cent slash for small taxpayers and a 20 per cent cut for most others.

Rayburn told newsmen following the democrats' meeting that they felt the entire matter of tax reduction should be deferred until congress has a better idea of the nation's fiscal situation and how much money will be appropriated.

"That will be the attitude of democrats in the committee and in the house," he commented.

The republicans counted on their five-man majority in the committee—made up of 15 republicans and 10 democrats—to drive through the income tax cut bill.

As approved by the republican house steering committee yesterday the bill gives a 30 per cent income tax slash to low-bracket taxpayers and a 20 per cent cut to most others. The original tax-cutting legislation was proposed by Chairman Knutson (R-Minn.) of the committee.

Navy Cruiser Slides Off Ways

QUINCY, Mass., March 21 (AP)—The navy's first air-conditioned cruiser, the 716-foot Salem—100th ship launched since Pearl Harbor at Bethlehem Steel company's Quincy yards here—goes down the ways Tuesday.

Except for the super-cruisers of the Alaska class, she and her sister ship, the Des Moines, launched here last September 27, are the largest cruisers yet built for the navy. They are 40 feet longer than their Baltimore class predecessors.

Sanitarians Name Grants Pass Man

PORTLAND, March 21 (AP)—William B. Quinn, Grants Pass, was elected president of the Oregon Association of Sanitarians at the annual meeting here yesterday.

Steady progress in the fight against stream pollution was reported by Harold Wendel, chairman of the state sanitary authority. He said more than \$17,500,000 of the \$23,000,000 needed for new municipal sewer systems has been accumulated.

Dr. Charles M. McGill, director of the industrial hygiene section of the state board of health, warned sanitarians not to bank on ultraviolet radiation to destroy all air-borne bacteria.

Taft Rejects CIO Discharge Demand

WASHINGTON, March 21 (AP) Chairman Taft (R-Ohio) bluntly rejected today a CIO demand that Gerhard D. Reilly be ousted from his job as a senate labor committee consultant.

The complaint against the former member of the national labor relations board came from CIO President Philip Murray. He contended that Reilly has a "known and organized animus toward demagogued labor."

Taft replied: "Mr. Murray does not seem to realize that the time has gone by when the CIO can hope to dominate the executive or the legislative branch of the government."
