

Allis-Chalmers, Longest Strike In History Of US, Ends With No Settlement

MILWAUKEE, March 24 (AP)—The longest major strike in the nation, UAW-CIO local 248's bitter and spasmodically bloody struggle at the honey plant of the Allis-Chalmers Manufacturing company, ended without a settlement today as lines of production workers filed quietly into the vast works.

A company check showed "slightly less than 5000" production workers reporting on the first shift. On Friday, the last working day before the strike ended, 4300 production workers

Engle Seeks Bug Control

WASHINGTON, March 24 (AP)—Rep. Engle (R-Calif.) wants to broaden the program to combat pine bark beetles and other forest pests.

He said today that a bill he has introduced would expand the insect-control program to areas under state and private ownership. It is now confined largely to federally-owned forests.

"Our forest resources are being seriously threatened by the pine bark beetle and similar pests, and unless action on a long-range program is taken immediately the situation may become hopelessly out of hand," Engle said in a statement.

He added that in the Ponderosa pine belt in California, Oregon and Washington approximately 16,000,000 board feet of commercial timber was destroyed by the bark beetle between 1931 and 1940. During a like period, he said, fires destroyed only 1,000,000,000 feet.

Engle said that a group of western senators and representatives will go before a house appropriations committee to request funds for the insect research and control work.

Mrs. W. C. Strong Hurt In Upset

Walter Mails Visits Here

Walter "The Great" Mails, Big League pitcher and now "pitching" for the American Red Cross as field representative of the seven western states, is spending several days in Klamath Falls in the interest of the 1947 campaign.

Mails faced a busy two-day schedule with visits to elementary and high schools, talks at Sacred Heart academy this afternoon, the Junior chamber of commerce tonight, talks at KUHS and the Lions club on Tuesday and other unrelated sessions. The former pitcher has transferred his affections from the baseball diamond to the Red Cross where he serves with the public relations department of the San Francisco office. He was with Frank X. Sexton, fund chairman, making contacts throughout the day.

The baseball player started his mound career 27 years ago. In 1916, he pitched the World Series for Brooklyn and played against the Boston Red Sox in the American league. In 1920 he pitched the World Series for Cleveland against Brooklyn and holds the distinction of 17-2/3 innings without being scored on.

Mails served in World War I with the 91st division, sergeant in the 363rd machine gun outfit, and in World War II with the U. S. marine corps as a staff sergeant, 4th marine division, 24th regiment, which saw service on Iwo Jima.

Today he loaned elementary school films which he has been showing at veterans hospitals including "Batting Stars of 1946" and "Pacific Coast League," in technicolor.

Battleship Back From Maneuvers

SAN DIEGO, Calif., March 21 (AP)—The USS Iowa dropped anchors off Coronado today after "surviving" a bombing and strafing attack from swarms of navy and marine planes in the final act of maneuvers which took the super-battleship to the central Pacific and back as flagship of task force 98.

Navy and marine scouting planes from here and El Toro sighted the returning task force yesterday, before the carrier Boxer and escorts headed for San Francisco and the cruisers Astoria, Springfield and Pasadena broke away for Long Beach.
