'Blue Monday' Hits Market

NEW YORK, March 24 (AP)—It was "Blue Monday" as the stock brokerage firms today as the market slipped through another of the slowest sessions for the past year and trends generally turned moderately bearish.

Inactivity ruled from the start with the ticker tape frequently at a standstill. While a few favorite leaders managed to keep on the recovery side, declines of fractions in a number of stocks dominated the close. Transfers tapered to around 900,000 shares.

All stocks were better than 22 points following ending of its long strike. Bonds were narrowly mixed.

Grain Futures Boom Upwards

CHICAGO, March 24 (AP)—Grain futures today were approaching the permissible daily advance of 10 cents as wheat active in the market strengthened. Barley marked up 10 cents while oats and rye strong their advance was not so rapid.

Commercial interests wanted wheat while profit cashing slowed up the advance at times all offerings were absorbed, and there considered light in the face of persistent demand based on exports.

The commodity credit corporation announced 350,000 bushels of corn has been sold to the United States and that offerings here would be entertained.
