When Herbert Hafer, 49, 1355 Austin, sawmill oiler, came on duty Wednesday morning he was unaware of the accident and at 6 a. m. went to the switch to start the machines in operation. The switch again flared and Hafer was knocked unconscious, remaining in that condition for one-half hour. First aid was given the oiler and after rest and treatment he was able to go back on the job yesterday.
