

RC Drive Nets \$10,656 Total

With intensified efforts of Red Cross drive chairmen, contributions have inched up to a total to date of \$10,656 toward the 1947 goal of \$25,000.

While rural communities which have reported are well over their quotas, only four of the 20 have been heard from so far. Reports are in from Chiloquin, Fort Klamath, Henley and Midland. Of these, Henley more than doubled its quota of \$300 by turning in \$658.

City residential and business districts are well behind in their quotas, according to Fund Chairman Frank X. Sexton, urging individuals to consider the benefits they are aiding by contributing to the Red Cross fund.

With the help rendered by the Red Cross in recent local disasters fresh in mind, it is well to remember, Sexton said, that this is not the full extent of work done by the organization.

Gift boxes are also packed by school students for overseas mailing to 18 foreign countries where they are distributed by Red Cross representatives.

Besides such benefits, summer swimming programs are sponsored each year for our own youngsters, a Red Cross junior summer camp is to be inaugurated at Lake o' the Woods this year, first aid stations are maintained and the needy in our community aided by the dollars we give now, Sexton said.

Reminders have been sent out to those who have not been heard from on the special gifts list, Sexton advised, acknowledging that many people have been out of town and sickness in the homes has delayed intended response.

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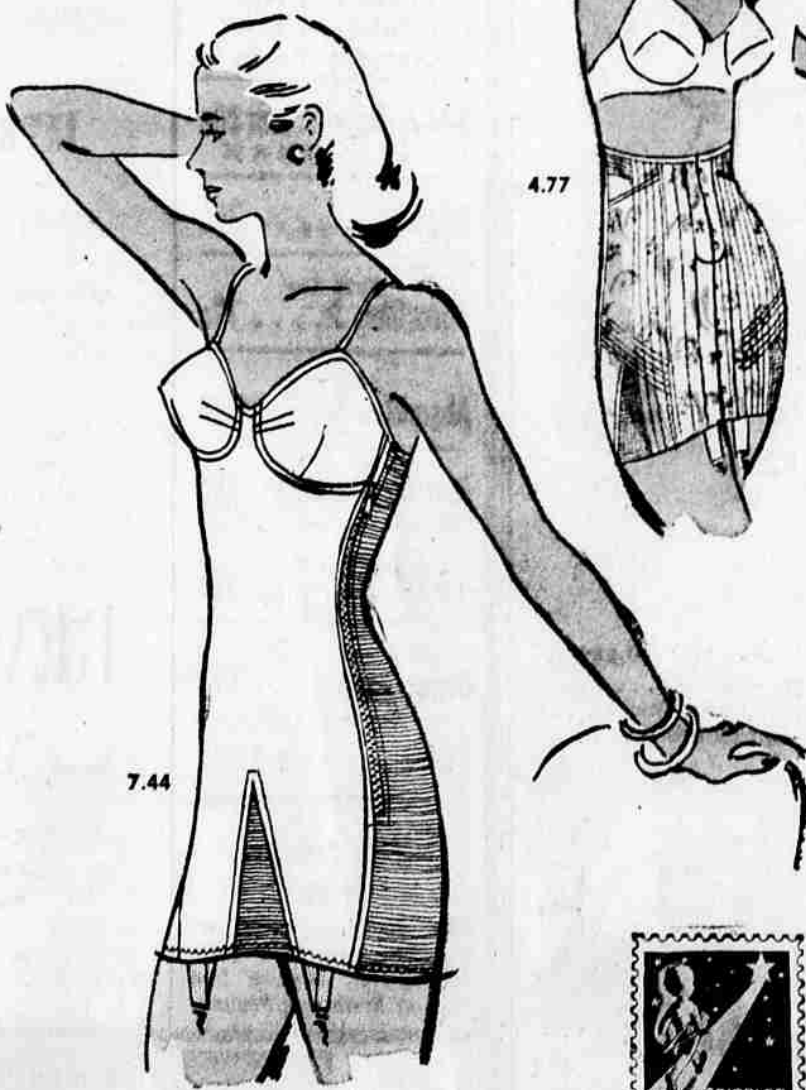
