

Antelope Population Down, Mule Deer And Sagehens On Increase On Sheldon Area

The sweeping Charles Sheldon antelope refuge and range, where antelope and deer play over high desert slopes visited only occasionally by men, was described by Jack Swartz, of the refuge staff last night to a large group of Lakeview and Klamath men and the members of the Modoc Council of Natural Resources.

Swartz spoke at a meeting at Alturas at which the Modoc council was host to members of the Klamath chamber of commerce, who went to the Modoc county seat in the afternoon and returned late last night. About 35 went from here, and four representatives were present from the Lakeview chamber of commerce.

After a dinner at Mary Arena's, the group adjourned to the Legion hall in Alturas, where a business session of the council was held followed by

Swartz' talk on the antelope refuge. Swartz said there has been a falling-off of the antelope population on the refuge, which may not number more than 1000 or 1500, but the mule deer there are showing a steady increase. The sagehen population in the region is gaining sharply, the refuge man said. He said there seems to be cycles of increase and decrease among all species of game, and sagehens, after suffering heavy losses, are evidently in the rising cycle. Mountain sheep, now missing from the area, may be reintroduced.

The Sheldon refuge lies wholly in Nevada, and is about 175 miles from Klamath Falls. It can be reached through Lakeview and Adel and over the rough Coleman canyon road southeast of Adel, or by a somewhat smoother route through Alturas and Cedarville. An interesting feature of the range is a Virgin valley, where there is a large deposit of opalized rock that is sought for fireplaces, rock walls and other special uses.

Limited stock grazing is permitted on the range, and the refuge staff is seeking to bring into improved use a number of old ranches embraced in the area. Antelope track back and forth between the Sheldon range and the Hart mountain antelope refuge, about 20 miles farther north in Oregon.

President John Houston of the Klamath chamber and Al Hattian, chairman of the intercity committee which arranged the trip, were introduced. District Attorney Charles Lederer of Modoc county made a short welcoming talk.

Four Klamath men—Louis Soukup, Don Sloan, Arthur Rickbell and Hattian—flew to Alturas for the affair, and others went down by automobile. A. B. Hood of Klamath Falls, Canby and Alturas, president of the Modoc Council of Natural Resources, presided at the dinner and the after-meeting.

United Sets Hawaii Fare

Klamath Falls residents will be able to fly from here to Hawaii at a fare of only \$149.15 when service is inaugurated May 1 under a tariff filed by United Air Lines with the civil aeronautics board in Washington, D. C.

The fares proposed by United will be substantially lower than present air fares between the mainland and Hawaii and less than the cost of average first class steamship accommodations," according to W. A. Patterson, United president.

Service on the 2400-mile San Francisco-Honolulu portion of the air trip from Klamath Falls will be flown with United's new 5-mile-a-minute four-engine Mainliner 300's (Douglas DC-6's).

The round trip fare is twice the one-way fare and all fares are subject to federal tax.

The free baggage allowance for passengers flying through from Klamath Falls to Honolulu is 55 pounds, contrasted with 40 pounds on domestic flights.

Bomb Office

GERMANY, Mar. 27 (AP)—A bomb explosion last night slightly damaged the Nuernberg office of the Bavarian commissioner for racial and political persecutions, a German official announced today.

At the same time other German officials in the American-occupied state of Bavaria reported a wave of anti-Semitic rumors reminiscent of Nazi days.

Hans Dillinger, chief of the commission office for middle Franconia, disclosed the bomb incident, adding that he "suspected the plot was laid by a Nazi underground movement as a warning to persecutions."
