Later he served in New Mexico, and accepted the position of superintendent of missions with headquarters in Albuquerque. The pastor states that he is one of the most prominent denominational leaders in the western states. His position brings him in contact with the present day problems and latest methods of missions and evangelism. While in the city Rev. Stringer has been in conference with the leaders of the local church relative to an expanded program of missions and denominational relationships.
