

Soviet Union Accused Of Sabotage

PHILADELPHIA, April 3 (AP) — The Soviet Union stood accused today of "sabotaging" the United Nations, and Eric Johnston declared it is up to the international body to determine whether Russia wants world union or world revolution.

Headlining a group of speakers at a rally of the United Nations council of Philadelphia, the former president of the U. S. chamber of commerce asserted that "Russia has been the chief culprit in undermining the United Nations."

Through use of "obstructive policies," Johnston asserted, the Russians so weakened U. N. that it was "powerless" to aid Greece and Turkey, thus forcing the United States to take the initial step.

Johnston, new president of the Motion Picture Association of America, said the United States' program of aid to Greece and Turkey is designed "to prevent war." He declared the U. S. aims to stop Russian aggression and help the Mediterranean nations help themselves.

Tule Police Check Thefts

TULELAKE, April 3 — Teen-agers were reported on the prowl in Tulelake Thursday night, according to Chief of Police Frank Rhodes.

Four teen-age boys were apprehended prowling the grammar school building, the night of April 2, said Rhodes' report, and another is in custody for "borrowing" a car for a 200-mile drive.

Grammar School Principal Reed discovered a boy in the school Thursday night, where he was caught by police. The youth's three companions were apprehended later. Reed said there was between \$15 and \$16 in the school, proceeds of Easter seal sales, which he thought the boys were after. Nothing had been taken.

J. M. Sasser, operator of the Homestead cafe, reported to police when a 16-year-old boy failed to return with his car, when sent to Sasser's home for some menus. The car, a new five-passenger coupe, was picked up at 11:30 in town by police, as the youth apparently was returning from a long ride, which the speedometer showed had covered 200 miles.

Young Funeral To Be Friday

TULELAKE, Calif., April 3 — Funeral services for Armine Oliver Young will be held at 3:30 p. m. Friday in Whitlock's chapel with the Rev. Hugh Bronson, pastor of the Tulelake Community Presbyterian church, reading the service.

Mr. Young, who operated a dairy and general farm a quarter of a mile south of the state line, which he homesteaded 23 years ago, died suddenly at 7:30 p. m. Tuesday.

He was a member of the American Legion post of Merrill and Klamath Falls, 1247 BPOE. The BPOE is in charge of the funeral services and burial in Klamath Falls Memorial park.

He is survived by his wife Cora and son Robert of Tulelake, and a daughter, Mrs. Ellis Peterson of Long Beach who has arrived for the services.

Palbearers will be Jack Ratliff, Ernest Treloar, Mike Fayne, Oscar Hammer and Walt Reynolds of Tulelake and Jess Dietler of Macdoel.

Wagner Sentence Due Today

Verne L. Wagner, former Klamath Falls police officer found guilty last Thursday of assault, armed with a dangerous weapon, will appear for sentencing at 4 o'clock this afternoon, Thursday, before Judge Charles H. Combs of Lakeview.

The penalty for assault is either one to 10 years in the state penitentiary, one month to one year in the county jail, or a \$100 to \$1000 fine, according to the decision of the judge.

Herbert P. Welch of Lakeview, Wagner's attorney, is expected to file a motion for a retrial at the time.

Parking Ticket Warrants Issued

Klamath Falls Police Chief Orville Hamilton today announced that he was issuing warrants on the overdue parking tickets which have been issued since the installation of the parking meters.

Hamilton said that all persons who had failed to come to the station and pay their 50-cent bail on the tickets, would receive a warrant, which calls for \$3 bail. Between 50 and 60 warrants will be issued, Hamilton said.

Duck Stamp Sale Nearly 2 Million

WASHINGTON, April 3 (AP) — Albert M. Day, director of the fish and wildlife service, said today 1,836,390 hunters—a new record—purchased \$1 federal duck stamps from July 1, 1946, to December 31, 1946.

He estimated that when final reports on the sale of 1946-47 stamps are in, they will exceed \$2,000,000. Stamp sales for the 1945-46 season totaled \$1,725,505.

LOS ANGELES, April 3 (AP) — A 10 per cent price reduction, effective immediately, on all grades of lumber was announced today by the E. K. Wood Lumber Co., which operates 15 yards in California and two mills in Oregon.

Vice President J. B. Wood said the retail price slash "is in line with President Truman's recent appeal to American industry. We hope our reduction will help veterans solve their problems."

The company handles approximately 100,000,000 board feet per year.

Tulelake Presbyterians Lay Plans For New Church

TULELAKE, April 2 — The congregation of the Tulelake Community Presbyterian church, meeting Monday night for the annual congregational meet in the church annex, took up plans for calling an assistant pastor, construction of a new church, elected officers for the ensuing year and heard financial reports of committees.

Rev. Hugh Bronson announced that the church will welcome a candidate for the assistant pastorate. Rev. Francis W. Chambers, Salem, Oregon, on Sunday, April 13. Rev. Chambers, a graduate of the Chicago Theological Seminary and of the University of Omaha, has been assistant pastor in the Presbyterian church at Salem for the past one and one-half years, his second affiliation in that capacity.

Shepherd Found Dead In Camp

TULELAKE, April 3—Fantof Tarton, 50, a shepherd employed by Leo Sagehorn of Tulelake, was found dead in his cabin Sunday. The man apparently took to his own life, officials said.

Sagehorn reported that he had employed Tarton March 26 and sent him out with a band of sheep. Sunday he sent Bard Fogle, another employee, to rescue the man and Fogle found Tarton lying on the bed with a rifle on the floor beside him. The bullet had passed through Tarton's head. The incident occurred in Modoc county and Tarton's body has been taken to Alturas where state patrolmen are investigating.
