

Weary Legislators Head For Home After Longest Session On State Record

SALEM, Ore., April 7 (AP)—Oregon's legislators were back home today after adjourning the 83-day session of the legislature, longest on record, early Sunday morning as both chambers unsmilingly their differences over tax bills.

The assembly left a general fund deficit of \$3,000,000 which it hopes will be made up by referendum tax issues.

The legislature voted a special election for its proposed 3 per cent retail sales tax bill, which exempts food, and in last minute action both houses voted to increase income taxes from the present 7 to 8 per cent for persons with more than \$8000 annual taxable income.

Linked to the sales tax bill, which will go to the voters for a sixth time October 7, are a cigarette tax of 2 cents a pack and a one per cent salary withholding tax. The cigarette tax will cease if the sales tax is approved and the withholding tax on wages will operate only if the sales tax fails.

Oregon Men Die In Crash

PORTLAND, April 7 (AP)—Col. James L. Travis, 35, former Portlander, and Kenton Case, 38, former University of Oregon student, were killed in the crash of an army C-47 transport in Tennessee Saturday, parents of the Portland native have been advised.

Four men were killed when the transport struck a mountain near Decaturville, Tenn., on a flight from Washington, D. C., to Memphis.

Col. Travis commanded a Flying Fortress group in the European campaigns and since has been assigned to Los Angeles aircraft plants as army representative in flying missile projects. He graduated from the University of Oregon in 1933 and entered the army air corps. Case, formerly a Honolulu radio news commentator, and Travis were fraternity brothers at the Oregon campus.

Search On For Oldest Barrel

Anybody got an old barrel? The kind they used in early day logging camps to keep steam donkey engines running.

Klamath county loggers have been asked to inform H. J. Cox, secretary of the ninth annual Willamette Valley Logging conference at Eugene, if they know of any really old barrels. The conference, May 2 and 3, will pay special honor to the oldest barrel that can be found, and preserve it for posterity, Cox said.

Old-time timber beasts also used water in the barrels to wash their hands, and sometimes to drink, for they worked hard in those days and got thirsty, Cox explained. They liked strong drink.

The rites honoring the oldest barrel will be conducted by the ancient Order of Elbow Benders in what used to be known as the "snake room" of the Osburn hotel, just before the annual banquet.

Export Shipments Show Big Tonnage

PORTLAND, April 7 (AP)—Export shipments from here in March totaled 179,432 tons and brought the first quarter of 1947 shipments to 453,391 tons with a value of \$38,662,932, the Portland merchants exchange reported today.

The exchange said coal represented the heaviest tonnage during the month, with 59,696 tons. Wheat, lumber, iron and steel products and flour ranked in that order.

University Head Urges Moral Tone

PORTLAND, April 7 (AP)—Need of a "moral tone" for the atomic age which will bring science and the arts and humanities closer together was suggested by Charles Seymour, president of Yale university, as he arrived here to address Yale alumni.

"If we let science get too far ahead, we may be ditched," Seymour asserted.

The complicated taxation problems, budget difficulties and education and welfare issues were largely responsible for prolonging the 44th assembly.

Passage of the one per cent increase in the income levy for persons making over \$8000 taxable income was forced out of the house by the senate as a means of recouping revenue lost by passage of the community property law. The community property bill is expected to cost the state fund \$1,000,000 and the new increase may recoup \$700,000 to \$1,000,000 of this amount.
