

Trespasses On Timber Land Up

An abnormal number of timber trespasses are continuing to occur on the O. & C. and public domain lands under the jurisdiction of the bureau of land management in Jackson, Josephine and Klamath counties, according to E. K. Peterson, district forester.

During the preceding six months 15 new trespasses have been discovered, involving 886,000 board feet of timber with an appraised single value of \$5443.95. All cases are being settled on the basis of double or triple stumpage. In trespass cases not reported by the trespassor, where he has failed to have the property lines clearly indicated by a competent surveyor, triple stumpage is demanded on the basis of gross negligence or deliberate trespass. At present average O. & C. stumpage prices in southern Oregon, triple stumpage amounts to \$28.00 per thousand board feet. In the event settlement cannot be made with the trespassor, the mill which receives the logs stolen from government lands is liable.

Logging operators are again urged to have all their property lines accurately run before starting to fall timber. If a trespass does occur, it should be reported promptly to the O. & C. office in Medford. If the operator does not report the trespass, it will be discovered sooner or later, the persons responsible located, and penalty payments required on the basis of current stumpage prices at the time the trespass occurred.

Recent trespass cases include: In Josephine county—Brooks and Taylor Lumber company, Williams, 7000 board feet; William Buckley, Williams, 19,000 board feet; Wesley Hasset, Grants Pass, 57,000 board feet; Donald Mayfield, Cave Junction, 32,000 board feet; Puget Timber company, Grants Pass, 730 linear feet piling; Loyd Silva, Grants Pass, 285,000 board feet; H. S. Sharp, Grants Pass, 168,000 board feet; and J. J. Villair, Cave Junction, 15,000 board feet.

In Jackson county—Brown and Denny, Medford, 74,000 board feet; Butte Falls Lumber company, Medford, 11,000 board feet; Sanders Bros. Lumber company, Medford, 13,000 board feet; Orville Thomas, Medford, 70,000 board feet; and George Yoxall, Jacksonville, 80,000 board feet.

In Klamath county—Tony Grace, Dorris, Calif., 25,000 board feet.

In Douglas county—Dick Darack, Azalea, 30,000 board feet.

Drive Starts To Furnish Food For Europe's Babies

In response to the nationwide appeal of the American Friends Service committee, an outright gift of one million packages of baby foods for the hungry children of Europe was announced today by H. J. Heinz II, president of H. J. Heinz company, Pittsburgh. At the same time Heinz stated his company stands ready to make a gift of additional millions of packages of baby food by giving one package for every package of Heinz baby food purchased by mothers throughout the United States during the week beginning April 7 and ending April 12.

In making this announcement, Heinz said, "There can be no lasting peace while millions of children in Europe go hungry. America promised that with victory would come food. This promise was a message of hope—hope for a better tomorrow. H. J. Heinz company realizes that these millions of packages will be but a small part of the total amount of food needed; yet no contribution is too small."

The first million packages of baby food are now ready for shipment. The food will be distributed throughout Europe by the American Friends Service committee, a Quaker relief organization, whose representatives will personally supervise delivery to the children. The Quakers will allot the food to the neediest children regardless of nationality or religion.

Commenting on the company's offer to match purchase for purchase, Mr. Heinz said, "We believe that American mothers will welcome an opportunity to take an active and effective part in the feeding of hungry children. Our offer means that the original contribution of one million packages can be increased several times and every mother will help to feed a child in Europe when she buys Heinz baby food for her own."

Klamath county's non-farm home owners will spend an estimated \$1,267,000 on repair and modernization work during 1947.

At least a third and probably more than half of all dwellings in the county will be improved this year, according to estimates released by the Title Council of America. "Increased supplies of building materials and easing of restrictions should make possible a record volume of home modernization throughout the country," said F. B. Ortman, chairman of the council's residential construction committee.

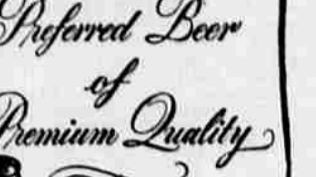
