## Apostoli Scores 3-Round Kayo Over Bobby Volk

SAN FRANCISCO, April 8 (AP)—Fred Apostoli, former world middleweight champion, scored a third-round knockout over Bobby Volk of Oregon City, Ore., here last night to wipe his comeback trail clean of the only defeat in it. Apostoli weighed 160 and Volk 157.

For Volk, who won the middleweight championship of the European theater while he was in the army, it was the first defeat in half a dozen professional fights. Last month in Hollywood, the Oregon City lad scored a technical knockout over the 31-year-old ex-champion when he opened a severe cut over Apostoli's right eye in the first round.

## Fish License Figure High

WASHINGTON, April 8 (AP)—For the privilege of fishing, sportsmen paid record-breaking fees of \$15,877,561 into state treasuries in the year ending last June 30.

Reporting this today, the fish and wildlife services said the states sold 11,068,717 licenses, including 1,093,099 non-resident permits.

This represented increases over the previous year of \$5,297,050 in revenue and 2,788,485 in licenses. Non-resident licenses increased 335,240.

California collected the greatest fishing revenue, \$1,545,026, but Michigan sold the most licenses, 904,557. California sold 764,577 for second place in the sales parade.

By states, the numbers of resident licenses, non-resident licenses and total fees paid included:

Idaho, 168,217, 27,597, \$252,928; Oregon, 164,530, 11,022, \$460,937; Washington, 369,032, 10,245, \$521,475.

## Purse Posted For Oregon Golf Tourney

PORTLAND, April 8 (AP)—A purse of \$1000 has been posted for the revival of the Oregon State Open golf tournament to be played at the Bend country club, May 26-27.

Larry Lamberger, president of the Oregon Professional Golfers association, said the 72-hole medal tournament may be stretched to three days if the Bend chamber of commerce succeeds in boosting the purse to \$1500 or \$2000. The field will be limited to 80 entries.

## Seals Accent Youth

The old story of youth vs. age headed into another chapter today as the Pacific Coast league began its second week.

The San Diego Padres (8-1) and San Francisco Seals (5-2)—both a balanced mixture of major and promising rookies—led the parade. The difference, a glance at the records reveals, is that the Padres' opening spurge was largely the work of veterans, while the Seals were put in the accent on youth.

The Padres, who will try to keep rolling at Portland's (3-4) expense, relied mainly on the booming bats of former Cincinnati Outfielders Max West and Dain Clay. West led all PCL regulars with a .578 mark, his eight hits including three homers. He drove in seven runs, Clay six on a .321 average embracing two boundary belts.

Lefty O'Doul's defending champion Seals, on the other hand, were paced by Charley Henson, rookie first sacker from Salt Lake City, who cuffed out 3 hits—most in the circuit—for an even .500.

Another ex-Salt Laker, Outfielder Joe Brovia, batted .333, while Neil Sheridan, a slightly more experienced young Seal, supplied two homers, nine runs batted in, and a .345 average.

The Seals entertain Jimmy Dykes' Hollywood Stars, starting tonight. The Stars showed fair power, blasting out five homers although dropping a 3-4 series to Sacramento.

Los Angeles (4-3), perhaps the league powerhouse with nine home runs in the first seven games, will try to get more mileage on their blows against Casey Stengel's Oakland Aorns who got off to a stumbling start (1-6) against San Diego.

Seattle's Rainiers (2-5) will try to improve their standing at the expense of Dick Bartell's Sacramento Solons (4-3) at Sacramento.
