

Zanuck Slates Espionage Film

HOLLYWOOD, April 10 (AP)—Film Producer Darryl F. Zanuck says he plans to make a movie based on "a story of Russian secret agents operating in the United States and Canada" and dealing with "espionage" and "atomic secrets."

Zanuck, executive vice president of 20th Century-Fox studios, said he was "inspired" to make the film by FBI Chief J. Edgar Hoover's report last March 16 to the house committee on un-American activities.

The film executive said Hoover's report showed that the Russians have in the United States "a definitely operating, menacing system, better organized than the Nazis before the war."

WASHINGTON, April 10 (AP)—Announcing his own opposition to the omnibus labor bill on which senate committee action is due tomorrow, Senator Morse (R-Ore.) today said he thinks "every employer in America" should oppose it.

Morse said he believed congress should pass separate bills dealing with individual aspects of labor relations.

Water Shortage Not Too Severe

BOISE, Idaho, April 10 (AP)—Indications of "slight to severe shortages of water for irrigation" in the extreme southern and western portions of the Columbia basin were reported yesterday by the soil conservation service.

Seriousness of the shortage will depend, the service said, on weather conditions during the planting and growing season.

The basin area as a whole, however, has a storage exceeding the average of the past 10 years. Five principal reservoirs in Washington are 94 per cent full compared to the 10-year average of 85 per cent. Oregon has an 82 per cent fill in 10 of the largest reservoirs, three per

Former Basin Woman Dies

Mrs. Anna Wickstrom, 73, well-known former Klamath Falls resident, died suddenly in Oakland, Calif., Wednesday, just 12 days after the death of her late husband, Capt. Anton Wickstrom.

Word was received by Mr. and Mrs. James Blair of 1527 Oregon, long-time friends of the Wickstroms.

Mr. and Mrs. Wickstrom were pioneer residents of the Klamath area, coming here in 1909 and

living in Klamath Falls until 1925 when they sold their boat company on Upper Klamath lake to the California Oregon Power company. They made their home in Oakland after leaving here.

Funeral services will be held Friday at the Clarence N. Cooper mortuary in the California city, with interment in the Mountain View cemetery. Survivors are Mrs. Esther Smith, a daughter, and William R. Stark Jr., a grandson, both of Oakland.

Quick Island Service Slated

Hawaii will be less than a day away by air from Klamath Falls, when United Air Lines on May 1 inaugurates direct, one-carrier service between this city and Honolulu. It was announced today by W. T. McIntyre, district traffic and sales manager.

Passengers from Klamath

Falls will leave here in the evening and fly to San Francisco for an overnight stop. The following morning they will board a high-speed United Mainliner 300 (Douglas DC-6) for the cross-Pacific flight. These planes will be identical with that which, on March 29, set an airline speed record from the Pacific to the Atlantic of 6 hours 47 minutes 13 seconds.

Use of such equipment will enable United to provide the fastest airline schedules ever operated from San Francisco to Honolulu — 9 1/2 hours. Leaving San Francisco at 10:30 a. m. PST, the flight will reach Hawaii at 5:10 p. m. HST. The return flight of just 8 2/3 hours will depart from Honolulu at 7 a. m. HST, arriving in San Francisco at 6:10 p. m. PST.
