**Padre Lead Slashed By Seal Squad**

Solons Also Breathing Down San Diego Necks

The Pacific Coast league race showed distinct signs of tightening up today as San Francisco and Sacramento began breathing down the necks of the San Diego Padres.

Both Seals and Solons picked up a full game on the Padres, who took an 8-4 lambasting—only their second loss so far—from Portland's rebounding Beavers last night.

San Francisco was only one game back of San Diego after edging Hollywood, 3-2. Two games off the pace was Sacramento, which leveled Seattle, 8-3. Oakland's Acorns became full-grown Oaks for the first time in the young season by walloping Los Angeles, 10-3, and rising to the dizzy heights of a seventh-place tie with Seattle.

The defeat left the Angels in fourth place, but a mere half-game to the good of Hollywood and Portland, in a fifth-rung deadlock.

Home runs by Bill Radulovich and Herman Reich led Portland's barrage against four Padre pitchers, with Vern Kennedy the loser. Jake Mooty hung up his second win for the Beavers, although needing relief help from Jake Salvesson. The Padres outhit Portland, 12 to 10, but couldn't bunch their blows effectively.

Southpaw Bill Werle pitched San Francisco to its win over portside ace, Joe Krakauskas. It was the third straight close defeat for Krakauskas, the second for Werle. Dino Regell's triple, surrounded by singles by Don White and Ray Ortig, was the biggest blow for the Seals.

Sacramento hopped on two Rainier flingers for a pair of big innings to down Seattle. Trailing 2-1, the Solons jumped Dick Barrett for three runs in the sixth, including Joe Marty's two-run homer, and finished off with four tallies against Jim Hopper in the eighth. The victory was the third straight for bespectacled Righthander Guy Fletcher.

Oakland, which had won only two close games previously, unleashed its pent-up attack good for 15 hits, including Les Scarsella's home and three singles by Pitcher Tommy Reis. Reis after his mates bashed home seven runs in the second frame, coasted to a six-hit triumph. Clarence Maddern four-plied for the losers.

**Gridders Champion Pest Welch**

SEATTLE, April 11 (AP)—University of Washington gridders took time out from their spring drill late yesterday to lash back at campus critics of Football Coach Ralph Welch.

A resolution signed by 92 football players blasted student members of the board of control for the Associated Students of the University of Washington, who earlier charged, in protesting a \$2500 annual salary boost for Welch, that he neither obtained the most from his material nor had the full support of the members of his squad.

The Washington's coach got a \$2500 salary increase to \$10,000 in spite of the student representatives' protest.
