WITH THE EIGHTH ARMY IN KUMAMOYO, Kyushu, Japan, April 1—Private Leslie B. Robinson, son of Mr. and Mrs. B. M. Robinson of Route 1, Box 1119, Klamath Falls, was recently assigned to the 21st Infantry regiment, a unit of the 24th Infantry division. The 24th division, known as the "Victory" division, is occupying the island of Kyushu, southernmost of the Japanese home islands.

Robinson entered the army in September 1946. After taking basic training at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, he was transferred to Camp Stoneman, California for assignment to duty in Japan.
