

Probing Reporter Solves Reefer Shortage In Basin

The mystery of the recent shortage of refrigerator cars from the great Northern tracks in the Klamath basin was solved Tuesday evening by a Herald and News reporter, who found the cars in use on the S-P (Shasta-Pacific) line.

Just as the inquiring reporter entered the doorway of the Klamath Hotel Railroad club's rooms in the basement of the U. S. National bank building, a long train of reefers, drawn by an SP (Southern Pacific) 2300 engine, came roaring around the outside track to pull up to a stop in the switch-yard. Besides the several GN reefers, here was one PFEEX (Pacific Fruit Express) reefer, another from the WVR&N and a caboose from the Southern Pacific.

The B and B gang on the S-P not to be confused with the subversive SP's have been and are busy with the construction of the numerous bridges which will cross the deep ravines and wide rivers of the terrain over which the line operates. Present plans call for about seven bridges in all.

Over in one corner of the large room a series of flashing lights on a board intrigued the H-N reporter, who found that it was a central control board for the entire line with the various tracks depicted schematically on it. When a train was in a certain section of the track, a light on the panel signified its location. A flick of a switch and the train could be continued on the main track or routed, by an electrical switch, to a branching track.

While the reporter was investigating the new operations of the line, a Santa Fe reefer had been added to the train and it began to roll from the siding, past the station house and onto the main line.

Around the first bend, up a grade toward the Grand Sierras, over the top and down the other slope it sped, and at its tail two cheerfully twinkling red lanterns said goodbye to the retreating track.
