Big News Now SO, Mr. Wallace goes over to the British socialists and immediately becomes big news. What he said was actually only what he had said so often in this country. The offense was not in the words, but in the violation of common decency and simplest common sense.

Such foolish attempts to destroy the government of the United States (for if its foreign policy is lost what would remain?) have in the past usually worked out their own destruction.

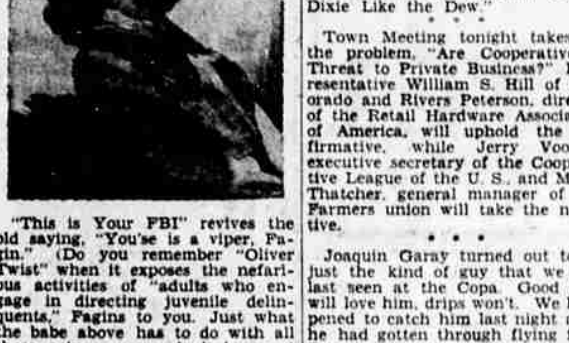
