**Bandit Car To Be Returned**

The 1937 Ford sedan which figured in the shooting match between city police officers and two escapees from San Quentin on Jefferson street March 31, is being returned to California today.  
 The car, owned by Cpl. Chester A. Suthard of Hamilton field, was stolen by Alfred A. Payne and Norman A. Jacklin, the escaped convicts, and driven to Klamath Falls.

Jacklin was captured here, and yesterday received an additional sentence of from one year to life for escape, the term to start with he finishes his present sentence early next year. Payne is still at large.

The car, which has been parked in the city hall garage since the shooting scrape, is being trucked to San Francisco by the Allstate Insurance company, and will probably be returned to Suthard. Also being returned is a tool chest and set of tools belonging to the U. S. army and other items found in the bullet-punched car.
