

Western GOP's Demand Truman Release Funds For Reclamation Jobs

WASHINGTON, April 19 (AP)—Western republicans urging their house leaders to approve more funds for reclamation and power construction today turned also on President Truman with a demand he release the money frozen by his economy order.

Rep. Horan (R., Wash.) announced he would introduce in the house Monday a resolution calling on the president to remove his freeze order of last August on funds for river and harbor development and reclamation projects and to order immediate steps to carry the work forward to the limit of funds available.

Horan, preparing to depart for Washington state, said in a statement that \$128,000,000 of interior department funds are being held under the freeze order and that 90 per cent of it is for reclamation projects.

Fund Held Up
He said \$84,591,250 of funds appropriated for the army engineers also are being held up, as well as \$166,550,000 of the \$351,550,000 appropriated by congress last year for flood control work.

"This amounts to a grand total of more than \$350,000,000 in funds already appropriated for reclamation and river development which the Truman administration has refused to expend," Horan said. "The holding of this money appropriated by congress for wealth-producing projects at this time can hardly be defended."

Horan said that refusal "of the Truman administration to use up funds granted for these purposes has been a major obstacle to efforts of true friends of national resources development."

Damage Suit Continued

The jury trial which was slated for Tuesday morning in circuit court was ordered continued indefinitely today because one of the defendants is somewhere in the Pacific aboard a naval vessel bound for China.

Homer O. Dupuy, S. 2 c., is named as a defendant, along with his father, Homer Orland Dupuy Sr., and Mrs. Alice Schiesel, in a damage suit for \$10,000 brought by Warren Ware, as administrator of the estate of Aini Ware.

Aini Ware was killed in an automobile accident near the Weed-Ashland junction last June 30. She was riding in a car driven by Mrs. Schiesel which collided with a vehicle driven by the sailor.
