

Suburban League Eyes Park Areas

Delinquency No Problem

A carefully considered recreational program including the establishment of parks and recreational facilities has been approved by the Klamath Suburban League, and the organization of a park district is now in the making.

The League, at a recent meeting, went on record to establish park facilities for the south suburban area to the end that "every citizen and every child receive benefits from a well planned and managed park system."

No Delinquency

"The League feels that the south suburban area does not, at this time, have much of a child delinquency problem," a spokesman said today, "and it is hoped to develop a program of recreation which will result in healthful studies in healthful bodies. To this end the League submits the following program:

"We recommend that residents of the south suburbs take immediate steps to organize a long range program looking to acquiring and developing a system of parks, playgrounds and recreational centers primarily for our young people, but not forgetting that all residents, young and old, should not be forgotten in this development. That a careful study be made to the end that no child shall live further than one-half mile from a public playground or park.

"That parks should be located in areas readily accessible from centers of greatest population density, and so located that children be able to reach them without being compelled to cross streets with heavy traffic.

"That steps be taken immediately to acquire ground for three primary parks, one north of So. 10th, one west of Summers lane and south of S. 6th, and one east of Summers lane and south of S. 6th, and that as rapidly as possible other parks and playgrounds be established so that no child be denied access to a public playground on account of distance or traffic dangers.

"That school grounds be developed and expanded to accommodate children's recreational and sports programs, and that additions be made to such school grounds, such as Shasta school, to provide more playgrounds, and that dangerous open ditches on school grounds be covered and other hazards eliminated.

Fair Grounds Use

"That the county fair board and the county court be contacted to the end of wider use of the county fair grounds be made available for recreational and community purposes, and that a building for community gatherings be constructed for use of 4-H clubs, Boy Scouts, Camp Fire Girls, farm organizations and any community non-profit educational or recreational gathering under adequate community control, and that a tax levy of 1/2 mill be made for this purpose until an adequate sum be raised for a suitable building, and to develop and beautify the fair grounds.

"The Suburban League, which represents all residents of the south

suburbs, realizes that this program cannot be carried forward without a legally organized park district, hereby goes on record as favoring the formation of such park district, and asks the cooperation of any and all suburban community organizations and individuals to this end, and that all such organizations appoint representatives to confer with and act with the Suburban League in carrying forward this project.

"The Suburban League suggests that the residents of each of the three community park subdivisions as named in this report meet and organize and take steps to select suitable sites for the proposed parks in their respective districts and to acquire options and the lands titled to as much of the possible sites as possible, pending the organization of the district, and that such community organizations become a part of the Suburban League in carrying forward the objectives of the plan as outlined by this report.

"The League understands the Shasta View resolution also has recently adopted a resolution favoring a park program. We invite joint action with the grange in this objective.

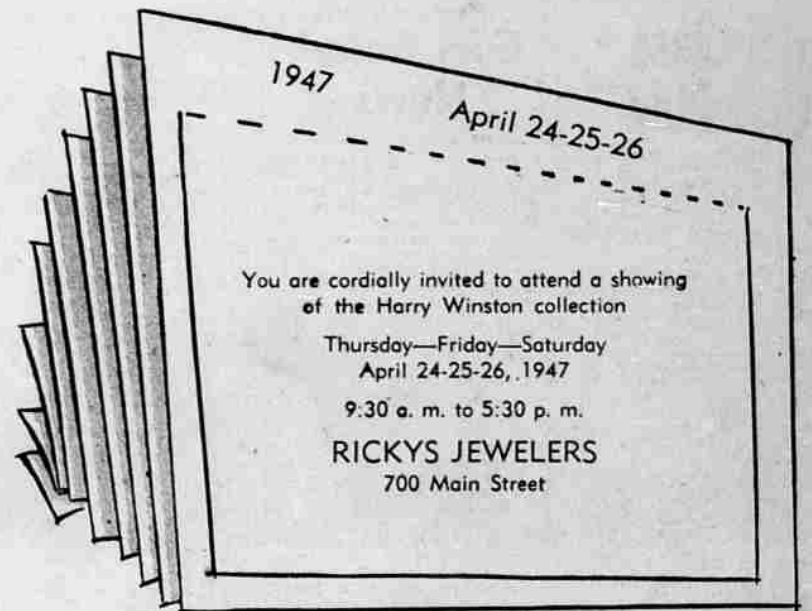
