

Wallace Hits US, Soviet Policies

PARIS, April 23 (AP)—Russia and the United States "have undermined the solemn cause for which their young men died," Henry A. Wallace said tonight.

Declaring he had found in Western Europe strong support for his world unity campaign, the former American vice president, in an address prepared for a meeting sponsored by the American veterans committee, said both Russian communism and American capitalism must change their present courses if peace is to be preserved.

Appealing for conciliation and understanding, he asserted:

"I believe that toughness breeds toughness and that both the United States and Russia by their actions have already undermined the solemn cause for which their young men died."

U. S. Committed

"I believe that the United States is committed by her history to a democratic civilization of competitive enterprise at a time when most of the rest of the world, afflicted by the misery of war and scarcity, is moving towards socialism or communism," he said.

"I believe Russia is committed by her history of centuries of czarist tyranny to the use of repressive measures as an essential element in holding the Soviets together until such time as an abundance of consumer goods makes possible the freedoms which mean so much to us in the West."

Earlier in an interview, Wallace declared that the Soviet Union should get from 10 to 17 billions of dollars worth of goods and services under a \$50,000,000,000 world reconstruction program, in return for which the Russians should be required to forego heavy reparations demands upon Germany.

Western Solons Oppose Slash

WASHINGTON, April 22 (AP)—The new interior department appropriation bill—drastically pared down from budget estimates—already is under fire from the senate side of the capitol.

The committee voted to give the bureau \$22,717,600. The group said in its report that carryovers of unexpended funds will permit the bureau a construction program of around \$141,000,000 for the fiscal year beginning July 1.

Rep. Stockman (R-Ore.), announced he will oppose the bill in its present form while aides of Rep. Horan (R-Wash.), said he will do likewise. Several other western representatives who were interviewed indicated that they had not yet decided what action they will take.

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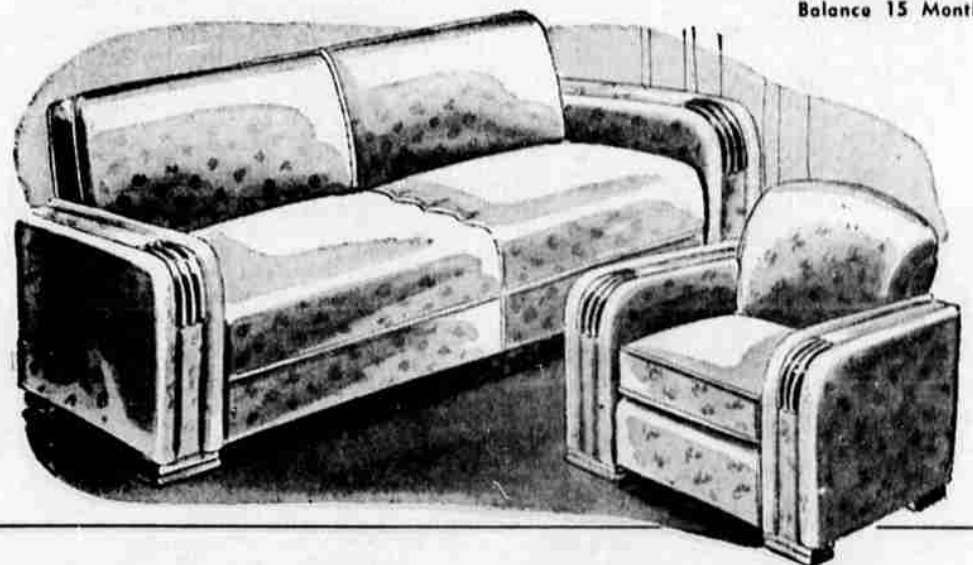
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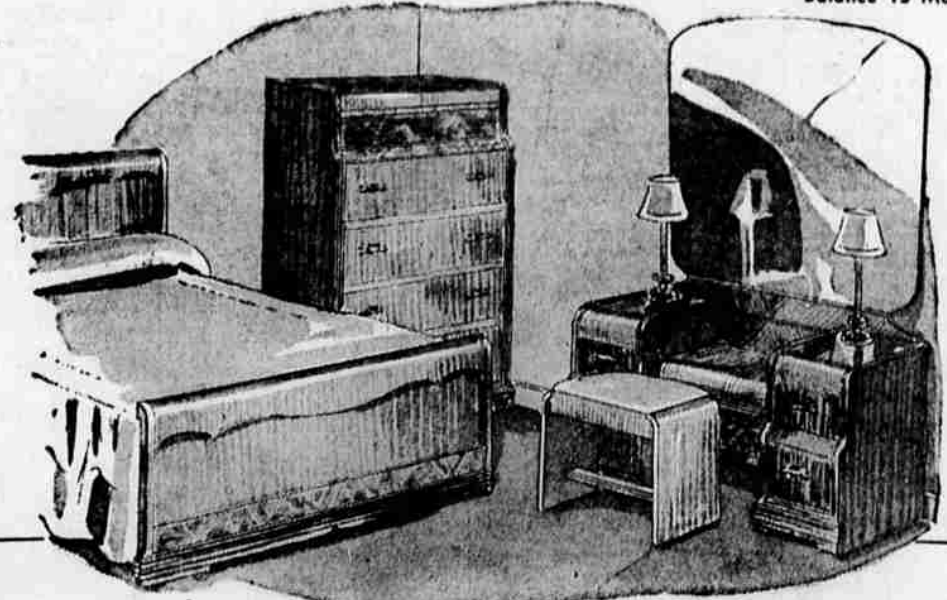
