Preliminary floor plans drawn by Howard Perrin, architect, were discussed in the Teen Canteen's meeting at the Lake hotel yesterday. The plans showed the square

footage of floor space almost identical to that of the present rooms in the armory but laid out more ideally. The main advantage of the proposed change would be the location, one of the most favorable obtainable.
The floor plans shown to the investigating committee included game space, snack bar, lounge, dancing space, cloakroom, stage and restrooms. A picture in color of what the new rooms might look like when completed was also studied.
Mrs. A. Smith, owner of the Lake hotel, would profit from the arrangement in that she would operate the snack bar for the teenagers and also have extensive re-

modeling done to her building by the group.
Dr. J. Martin Adams completed the annual tuberculin testing in KUHHS today by checking the results of all tests given Tuesday.
