

# Chapel To Be Built By 1st Baptist

The First Baptist church, N. 8th and Washington, has completed negotiations for the purchase of an acre of property at Altamont drive and LaVerne street for a building site for a mission chapel, according to an announcement by the pastor, C. C. Brown.

Rev. Brown states that three years ago this property was considered during the revival services conducted by Rev. D. C. Stringer. Recent surveys have justified the purchase of the property.

The pastor states that this is another step in a carefully planned program of evangelism and missions. He says that the purpose of the church in securing mission property in the suburban areas is to establish mission chapels for the operation of Sunday schools, vacation Bible schools, and revival meetings.

Plans are being formed for the building of a chapel on the property on a similar way this summer, and the Men's Brotherhood hopes to develop a playground on Altamont until a building can be erected.

Rev. Brown states that he will continue the course of sermons on "The Parables of This Age" at the Sunday services.

At 11 a. m. Sunday he will speak on "The Parable of the Mustard Seed." The message Sunday at 8 p. m. will be based on "The Parable of the Leaven." The speaker will delineate the character and purposes of the Kingdom of Heaven. He will chart the course of this age from the viewpoint of scripture, and point out the task of Christianity in this dispensation.

The public is cordially invited to hear these special discussions.

Peace Memorial church in the Altamont district, with the acquisition of a chapel from Camp White at Medford and a building from the former Japanese colony at Newell, has made plans for an extensive building program during the summer months.

The chapel from Camp White, with a floor space of 37 feet by 97 feet, has an altar, rail, pulpit and other interior trim of gumwood. This building will be used as the sanctuary after being moved here in sections via the Green Springs.

Twenty-five feet of this building will be used as the educational plant planned by the church but both units will be under one roof.
