**Truck Service Lack Talked**

The lack of any type of through truck service from the Klamath basin to Los Angeles was pointed out today by I. W. Shepard, traffic manager for West Coast Fast Freight, whose company is attempting to obtain permission from the interstate commerce commission to establish such a through run.

Shepard explained that although the company could run their trucks through Klamath Falls between Los Angeles and Portland, they were forbidden by ICC ruling to load or unload merchandise here. At the present time, Shepard explained, Klamath shippers must send and receive either through Medford or Portland, entailing the additional expense of the extra shipping, and necessitating transshipment in transit.

Shepard is on his way to the final hearing of the company with the ICC in Portland May 1, and is in Klamath Falls in an attempt to gather a group from this city who would care to attend the meeting and express their wishes and opinions in the matter. This hearing, Shepard said, was a continuation of the preliminary hearing held November 20 at Los Angeles. Upon the May 1 meeting, he added, will depend whether or not Klamath shippers will have through access to the Los Angeles markets for their products.

Shepard is staying tonight at the Willard hotel and is desirous of meeting with local shippers who are interested in obtaining through service.

**Spud Planting Under Way**

Besides some miscellaneous spud planting in progress in the south end of Klamath basin, Pete Wilkerson started Sunday planting about 60 acres on the Colwell brothers place on the Keno road.

For the most part seedling grain barley, flax and wheat, is using the labor and daylight hours for growers in the basin, although a good deal of plowing and preparing the ground for spud planting is also being done.

Around May 1, potato planting is expected to show more activity and cutting seed is going on in many of the cellars now. The bulk of potato planting is usually done in this area between May 5 and May 20, and this year is expected to follow the usual program in planting. Spuds planted before May 1 get a few pups from the frost which often occurs about the time the young plants start to come up.
