A full program is planned for the day from 10 a. m. to 3:30 p. m., starting with registration and viewing exhibits. An audience participation broadcast over KFLW with attractive gifts from Klamath merchants will be held at 11:30 a. m., followed by luncheon served to the first 200 obtaining tickets, at 12 noon, when a style review will be presented by the Poe Valley-Olene unit, showing attractive garments fashioned from feed bags.

During the afternoon a general meeting will be held in the church auditorium, when KUHHS will furnish special music and there will be talks by Mrs. Erma Little, extension specialist in family relations, and Mrs. Mabel Mack, assistant state home demonstration leader from Oregon State college.

Each of the 15 extension units in the county will have an exhibit on work they have accomplished through a project during the past year, with the county committee, county library and camp committee participating.

The home demonstration office has been a hive of activity the past few weeks, outlining the highly interesting and varied program for the 1947 festival, and a most cordial invitation is extended to the public to attend. There is no charge.

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Salesmen Ask Guarantee

PORTLAND, April 29 (AP) — Salesmen of the Pacific Fruit and Produce company returned to the picket line here today asking a guarantee of \$3,000 a year, two weeks vacation and a \$50 a month car allowance.

Eddie J. Hawes, international representative of the AFL retail clerks, reported the principal issue of the dispute was the car allowance and said all other Portland wholesale produce firms had signed contracts for similar terms.

Hawes said AFL clerks and cooks have been asked not to handle any of the struck plant's products. The pickets appeared last week briefly, then were withdrawn.

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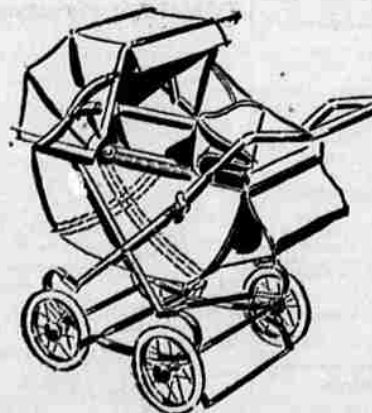
