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Mountain States Power Cuts Rates

SALEM, May 2 (AP) — Mountain States Power company will reduce its electric rates by about 7 per cent for its 9000 Coos county customers on June 1, Public Utilities Commissioner George H. Flagg announced today.

The commercial rates will be cut \$45.841 a year, with residential rates to be reduced \$24.516.
