Locker Men Discuss Law

Locker operators of Klamath Falls and the surrounding territory held a dinner meeting at the Winema hotel Thursday evening, with Morgan Johnson of Bratton's Packing company arranging the session. Johnson introduced John D. Trullinger, president of the Oregon Frozen Food Locker association, and John M. Lausinger, secretary of the state organization.

Operating conditions were discussed and it was pointed out that in this section locker rentals are below the national average of \$2.50 per cubic foot per year. Trullinger outlined the new locker law, sponsored by the association, which will go into effect July 1. The ruling will be enforced by the department of agriculture, and requires sanitary conditions, safety devices for the protection of patrons, and a recording thermometer

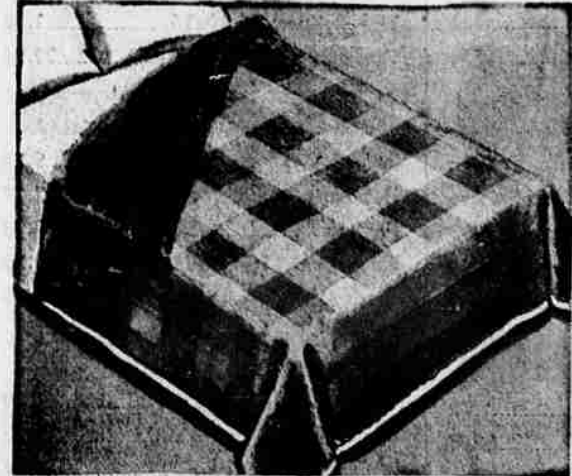

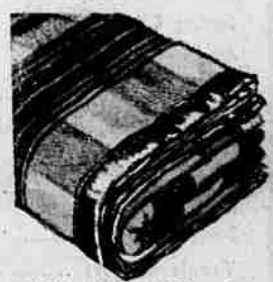

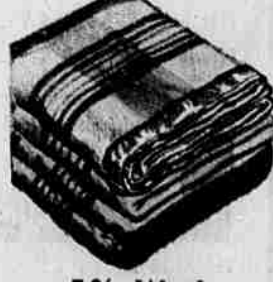
