

British Troops Launch Holy Land Search For 227 Escaped Prisoners

JERUSALEM, May 5 (AP)—British troops and police fanned out over northern Palestine today in a great manhunt for 227 Jewish Arab prisoners still at liberty after a mass delivery from Acre prison engineered yesterday by the Jewish underground.

Construction Shows Decline

NEW YORK, May 5 (AP)—F. W. Dodge corporation, research organization, today reported evidence of a recession from the high volume of construction indicated earlier this year.

"Buyers have assumed control of the construction market," Thomas S. Holden, president of the company, said in an analysis of data compiled from project contracts awarded in the 37 states east of the Rocky mountains.

Contract volume totaled \$24,000,000 per business day in the first three weeks of April, compared with \$28,000,000 in March and \$33,000,000 in April last year, the agency said.

The decline was general, affecting non-residential building, residential building, and heavy engineering construction.

"In view of the known demand," Holden stated, "the only important reason to which the recession can be ascribed is the rapid rise in costs in the last six months."

Salesmen Settle Wage Dispute

PORTLAND, May 5 (AP)—AFL salesmen and the Pacific Fruit and Produce company have settled their wage and allowance dispute and Union Agent Lou Braunstein said picketing had halted Saturday.

The union official said the agreement guarantees \$300 a month salary and more liberal car allowances and vacations.
