

Kesselring Sentenced To Death

VENICE, May 6 (AP)—A British military court today sentenced Field Marshal Albert Kesselring, former supreme German commander in Italy, to death by shooting after convicting him of war crimes against the Italian people.

Kesselring's counsel, Dr. Hans Latenser, had declined to ask for clemency after the verdict was announced, saying:

"He expressly asked me not to address the court any further."

The attorney said later, however, that he himself would "appeal personally against the sentence."

C. L. Stirling, the judge advocate, announced that both the conviction and the sentence were subject to review by "the appropriate military authority"—in this case, Lt. Gen. Sir John Harding, commander of British central Mediterranean forces.

Kesselring was convicted on two counts, one of them accusing him of responsibility for the Ardeatine caves massacre in which 335 Italians died in reprisal for the killing of 32 German police troops. He was the third German officer to be sentenced to death for that slaughter. The others were Col. Gen. Eberhard von Mackensen, formerly second in command in Italy, and Lt. Gen. Kurt Maeltzer, commander of Rome during the German occupation. They were sentenced last November, but neither of the sentences have as yet been confirmed by the high command in Italy.

Pulitzer Prize Goes To AP Bureau Head; Warren

NEW YORK, May 6 (AP)—Eddy Gilmore, chief of the Associated Press Moscow bureau, today was awarded the Pulitzer prize for a distinguished example of telegraphic reporting in international affairs.

The Baltimore Sun was awarded the Pulitzer prize for the most distinguished and meritorious public service rendered by an American newspaper during the year.

The award was given for a series of articles by Howard M. Norton on administration of unemployment compensation in Maryland which resulted in conviction of 93 persons.

The annual prizes, which were announced by the Columbia University trustees, also included an award to Edward T. Follard of the Washington Post for a distinguished example of reporting on national affairs in the United States. This prize was for a series of articles on the Columbians, Inc.

Arnold Hardy, a student at Georgia Tech and amateur photographer whose dramatic Wincoff hotel fire

picture was distributed by the Associated Press last December, won the news photograph prize.

Hotel Fire Picture
His picture, showing a woman leaping to her death from the Atlanta hotel, was purchased by the Associated Press. The blaze, which claimed 119 lives, was the worst fire in the nation last year.

The award for distinguished editorial writing went to William H. Grimes of the Wall Street Journal. Brooks Atkinson, former Moscow correspondent of the New York Times and now that paper's dramatic critic, won the prize for distinguished correspondence during 1946 with a series of articles on the Soviet Union.

The prize for the novel was awarded to Robert Penn Warren's "All the King's Men." No award was given to a play this year.

For a distinguished example of a cartoonist's work, the annual prize went to Vaughn Shoemaker of the

Chicago Daily News for his cartoon "Still Racing His Shadow."

The cartoon depicts a laborer labeled "New Wage Demands" running and casting a shadow labeled "Cost of Living."

Reporter Wins
Frederick Woltman of the New York World Telegram won the prize for a distinguished example of a reporter's work. The award was for articles on infiltration of communism in the United States.

Other literary prizes:
History—James Phinney Baxter, III, for his book "Scientists Against Time."

Biography—"The Autobiography of William Allen White."

Verse—Robert Lowell for "Lord Weary's Castle."
