WASHINGTON, May 8 (AP)—The civil aeronautics administration informed Idaho congressmen today it has approved expenditure of \$384,000 on the Twin Falls, Idaho, airport.

Turkeys To Be Raised

TULELAKE, May 8 — Already there are 18,000 bronze turkey poult in pens at Modoc Turkey farm and 20,000 eggs are being incubated, according to Shuck brothers, owners. Before the end of the season 10,000 more eggs will be set.

Shuck brothers originally planned to offer some of the poult for sale, but now expect to raise the entire lot for Thanksgiving and Christmas trade.

Almost no mortality occurred this season, due likely to hatching the poult at the plant instead of having them shipped in. Bruce Hagerman is plant manager.
