

Herald And News Reaches Friends All Over World

From the Isle of Brian Bhoru to Fujiyama land The Herald and News carries tidings of Klamath life over the western hemisphere to former residents and friends and relatives of local Klamathites.

A perusal of the mailing lists of the Herald and News reveals names of old friends and fellow natives of the basin area who still keep up their subscriptions, regardless of how near or far away they might be.

The Herald and News developed so many subscribers in old Erin that a circulation department employee was dispatched to the land of St. Patrick to keep track of them. The names of the towns in which these former Klamathites reside are enough to tax the abilities of an H-N copyreader. Della is now visiting in Kilkenny, Tuam county, Galway, Ireland. Other transplanted sons of the auld sod are Jerry Ahern at Ballinabearna, Ballyvarvan, County Cork; Con McCarthy at Boherbee, County Cork, and Maurice O'Keefe at Coolykerreen, Kanturk, County Cork.

Several hundred miles to the north and east of the Emerald Isle, at the tip of the Swedish peninsula, Werner Lundquist opens his Herald and News when the morning

mail arrives at Tallberg, Sweden, and reads about his friends thousands of miles away.

Around to the other side of the

world an army man in Tokyo receives The Herald and News, probably sent by his parents or friends, or through the guise of an APO number. We were unable to find his name but a letter from a friend in the army press relations department in Japan told us that every once in a while a friend there gave him a copy of the Klamath paper. There are four Klamath men on the H-N subscription list with Japan APO numbers.

Along the eastern seaboard of the United States we noticed the names of Cadet Elmer L. Burk at West Point, and Col. Bernard Dabel, Marine Barracks' first commanding officer, at the Marine Barracks, Parris Island, South Carolina. Both former residents continue to receive their paper.

Elsewhere on the mailing list was the subscription of Representative Lowell Stockman at Washington, D. C., who keeps track of his constituents in Klamath county every day through H-N.

Other names in other places in the country meet our eyes in a quick glance through the mailing list. Persons in Swannanoa, N. C.; Lafayette, Ind.; Spring Valley, Wis.; Summit, N. J.; Boca Roton, Fla.; Detroit, Mich.; Pampa, Tex.; New Orleans, La., and one man on the U.S.S. Pickaway, with the Pacific fleet. Four subscribers are listed in Alaska.

The Herald and News lists a paid circulation of around 12,370. Of the total some 620 are mailed each day to subscribers outside of the immediate vicinity of Klamath Falls.

Water Limit Talks Heard

WASHINGTON, May 8 (AP)—The senate irrigation subcommittee allotted time today to hear from California farmers opposed to removal of the 160-acre limitation from the Central Valley irrigation projects.

Senator Downey (D-Calif.) remained firm, however, in his contention that the limitation cannot be made to work in the Central valley because of lack of control over underground waters which will be replenished generally by the projects.

Downey is co-sponsor of a bill to exempt the Central valley, the San Luis valley in Colorado and the Valley Gravity canal in Texas from the law preventing delivery of water from a federal reclamation project to more than 160 acres of land in a single ownership.

After three days of hearings, Downey said reclamation bureau officials and other opponents of the bill have failed to advance a practical way to induce excess landowners to join the project and transfer small landowners from paying the entire cost of the irrigation works.

Liberty Ship Tow Abandoned

PORTLAND, Ore., May 8 (AP) — Plans to tow the Liberty ship John C. McLean to Seattle for repairs have been cancelled and the maritime commission announced the repairs may be completed here.

The commission spokesman said the ship has been picked by AFL unions demanding a stand-by crew of about 25 men instead of three seamen originally arranged for the haul to Seattle.

The Sailors Union of the Pacific demands 122 sailors and a boatwain and the Masters, Mates and Pilots asked that a master, three mates, two engineers and a steward's and cook's staff be included. The ship is to be sold to the French government.
