

Administration May Ask \$75 Million To Reinforce Southern Korean Position

WASHINGTON, May 8 (AP)—An approaching administration plea for perhaps \$75,000,000 to reinforce Southern Korea confronted congress today as the house entered the voting stage of its fight over helping Greece and Turkey resist communistic domination.

After two full days spent in general discussion of the \$400,000,000 Greek-Turkish aid bill, the house turned to specific proposals for restricting the program and changing its terms. Chief among the amendments likely to be put to a showdown test before nightfall is one to shift the burden to the United Nations.

To a hushed house near the close of yesterday's debate Democratic Leader Rayburn of Texas cried out against a return to "isolationism."

In impassioned tones, he declared: "God help us, God help this world, if we do not accept our responsibility to help countries that do not want to be smothered by communism."

From across the aisle, where the republicans have been divided on the issue since it first was posed by President Truman nearly two months ago, Rep. Wadsworth (R-N. Y.) voiced the answer of those in GOP ranks who have lined up behind the administration's expanding foreign policy.

Liberty Defended
"I am convinced," Wadsworth said, "that when we defend liberty the world over we are defending our own liberty. This measure is a forthright declaration in the support of liberty is never finished. We must stand up on our feet and support liberty."

Crab Take Said High

ASTORIA, May 8 (AP)—The crab canning and freezing industries of Astoria and Warrenton have received 1,900,000 pounds of crabs for processing this season despite unsettled conditions early in the season when the price was falling, the U. S. fish and wildlife service reported today.

Receipts at Grays Harbor, where a strike tied up the fleet for 30 days, have reached a record volume for the area. Early this week the catch was estimated at 1,200,000 pounds.

In Astoria during the past week as much as 40,000 pounds have come in daily.

Shasta Dam To Get Tourist Road

WASHINGTON, May 8 (AP)—The U. S. bureau of reclamation is going to build a tourist highway to Shasta dam.

The Harms brothers, Sacramento, lowest of 11 bidders, will build the four-mile road from state highway 209 at Summit City, Calif., to Shasta for \$814,273, the bureau said.

The construction, north of Redding, Calif., will include a parking area for tourists at the left abutment of the dam. It must be completed within 10 months.
